With a quorum present, Mayor Houk called the Regular Meeting of the River Oaks City Council to order at 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 19, 2024 at River Oaks City Hall, 4900 River Oaks Blvd., River Oaks, Texas 76114.

Jolly Walia was present. JJolly's opened in April 2024. Tarrant County started Long Avenue in June 2024 and it lasted three months. There were no sales during this time because people said it was too inconvenient to get to. Total JJolly's lost 7 months of sales due to issues that he had no control over. His property tax bill is \$18,000.00. Normally a 380 agreement is approved by the city council, but it is usually on a development that is ongoing. We can add this on the next EDC agenda in December since the taxes are not due until January 31, 2025.

Myra Hodges and Jason Gleva were present. It took two days to clean this property. The only thing left is the tires and they will be gone tomorrow. Someone has ripped the copper out so the electrical must be upgraded. Jason Gleva does not have the time or the crew to fix this house up. It is being sold to Keith Kidwell which has several houses around. He can have it off substandard in about three weeks.

At 6:38 p.m., Mayor Houk closed the Public Hearing.

13. ACTION FROM PUBLIC HEARING: CONSIDER COUNCIL ORDERS ON THE PROPERTY AT 5609 JAMES DRIVE THAT MAY INCLUDE SECURING, VACATING OF OCCUPANTS, REMOVAL, REPAIRING OR DEMOLITION OF STRUCTURE(S) OR ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION IMPLORING A FEDERAL AGENCY TO ABATE ALL SUBSTANDARD VIOLATIONS IN ORDER TO BE BROUGHT INTO COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 3.07.004 OF THE RIVER OAKS CODE OF ORDINANCES (2006) AS AMENDED.

CM Holland moved, seconded by CM Claridge that the City Council finds that the building located at 5609 James Drive based on evidence presented at this hearing, is substandard and 1) that the conditions set forth in the Building Official's report exist to the extent that the life, health, property, or safety of the public (and occupants of the building(s), if applicable) are endangered; and 2) that the building(s) is/are feasible of repair and therefore order the building to be repaired by the owner within 89 days and the lienholder or mortgagee to within an additional 3-days if the owner does not comply; and 3) the board orders commencement of repairs within 30-days and has established specific time schedules with the owner or mortgagee for the repair; and 4) order that the building be repaired in conformance with the requirements of Section 3.07.004 of the River Oaks Code of Ordinances (2020) as amended or demolished by the owner and the debris removed within 89 days or by the lienholder or mortgagee wo within an additional 30-days if the owner does not comply and further find that if the building is not repaired within 89 days, that there is no reasonable probability that the building will be repaired within a reasonable period of time if additional time is given. If the building is not repaired within a reasonable period of time if additional time is given. If the building is not repaired within 89 days in full conformance with Section 3.07.004 of the River Oaks Code of Ordinances (2020), the building shall be demolished; and 5) order that a substandard fee of \$150.00 be paid upon permit issuance. Certificate of Occupancy will not be finished until all substandard fees are paid in full. All voted "Aye".

At this time, Mayor Houk went to Item #8: Derrick Foss was present online and presented a presentation. This will get Public Works from having a lot of paper, they will gain efficiencies, and this can leave a legacy. This system will monitor inventory and send an alert when it gets low. This system will integrate with Incode and will work on apple and android phones. You can add the Police and Fire at no extra charge. This is already budgeted and the second year after the first year will be \$7,815.63 and 3% annually increases. It was brought up that staff needs to check with Incode to see if Incode 10 has something like this.

No action was taken.

At this time, Mayor Houk went to Item #10. The Public Hearing was continued at 7:25 p.m. David Villalobos was present online and is the new owner, but it is held back in closing. The tires are all on a trailer. The previous owners are supposed to be getting the rest of the contents out. David filed a plan of action and emailed it to CM Gregory. This house will be completely renovated. The solar panels were taken off, so the roof has to be either repaired or replaced. The plan is to renovate this house and to sell it and should take about two months to complete. BI Sanders has already deemed it substandard. But has not been able to get into the house because the tenant has a pit bull.

At 7:39 p.m., Mayor Houk closed the Public Hearing.

It was the intent to replace the doors in the current budget, but there was an emergency and had to replace doors now. One door dropped and the opener doesn't work. Can not repair the existing doors because they cannot get the parts. These doors were the original doors when this complex was built. Five doors have been replaced with five new openers. Panther City is the low bid, which are in River Oaks. They have been repairing these doors for years.

CM Turner moved, seconded by CM Claridge to approve expending the funds for the Fire Department overhead doors out of the 2021 CO bond. All voted "Aye".
