8. CONSIDER AND ADOPT ORDINANCE #1322-2021 AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF CITY OF RIVER OAKS, TEXAS, COMBINATION TAX AND LIMITED SURPLUS REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, SERIES 2021; LEVYING AN ANNUAL AD VALOREM TAX AND PROVIDING FOR THE SECURITY FOR AND PAYMENT OF SAID CERTIFICATES; APPROVING THE OFFICIAL STATEMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND ENACTING OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE SUBJECT.

Craig Cunningham and Sam Gill were present. The bonds were sold today. Received 3 firms and recommends awarding the sale to Raymond, James & Associates at 1.794% interest. The total sources are \$3,520,446.55 which includes the underwriter's discount, cost of issuance, library/city hall improvements, street improvements and rounding amount. We don't have to use specific amounts to each improvement. The net interest is 1.7949551% and the true interest cost is 1.7416951%. The cost of issuances is \$71,665.00 which includes the financial advisor, model and structuring, bond counsel, paying agent/registrar, rating agency fee, AG fee, and miscellaneous. We can refinance in 10 years if the rates are lower. We will have to revise the Ordinance because of the I & S levying lowering.

CM Claridge moved, seconded by CM Rodriguez to approve Ordinance #1322-2021 subject to the correction of the I & S. All voted "Aye".

9. CONSIDER APPROVAL TO AWARDED CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT TO EXCEL 4 CONSTRUCTION, LLC FOR TEXAS WATER DEVELOPMENT BOARD PROJECT CWSRF #73749, PRIORITY PROJECT 3, FROM ALL BIDS RECEIVED AND OPENED AT 1:00 P.M. ON AUGUST 18, 2021 IN THE RIVER OAKS COUNCIL CHAMBERS.

Trevor Truss, with Hamilton Duffy was present. This is the last remaining funds, and we can do one more sewer project. Bids were opened on August 18, 2021 and the lowest bid was \$419,406.00 from Excel 4 Construction. The remaining budget is \$379,938.89 and Excel 4 has agreed to a change order. This project will include the intersection of Churchill and Barbara, and a section on Almena.

CM Claridge moved, seconded by CM Chisholm to award the bid to Excel 4 Construction with a change order, making the total amount \$375,355.00. All voted "Aye".

(ZONING CASE #SP-PZ2021-0009).

At 7:28 p.m., Mayor Ashton opened the Public Hearing.

Jolly Walia was present. This was presented to the Planning & Zoning Commission on August 16, 2021. Still waiting on TXDOT for the final approval. Once construction starts, it should take about 6-7 months to complete. Lacking is the purchase agreement for the 417 square foot property, the encroachment agreement, and the amending plat. Brought the landscaping plan to the Planning & Zoning Commission. Had to relocate the building due to the drainage lines. Planning & Zoning voted unanimously to recommend to the City Council.

At 7:32 p.m., Mayor Ashton closed the Public Hearing.

(ZONING CASE #SP-PZ2021-0009).

CM Chisholm moved, seconded by CM Claridge to approve the proposed site plan at 4710 River Oaks Blvd. subject to TXDOT approval, with the following actions to be completed: 1) close on sale with the City to purchase 139-feet x 3-feet of right-ofway; 2) enter into an Encroachment Agreement with the City to concrete and have

access for a drive thru (approved by council, waiting to be executed); 3) amend the property plat regarding the boundary line change to incorporate the additional 417 square foot of land that can be approved by the Public Works Director without public hearings (not completed); and 4) obtain TXDOT approval for Egress and Access (in process). All voted "Aye".

12. PUBLIC HEARING: IN ORDER TO RECEIVE CITIZEN COMMENTS ON THE PROPOSED APPLICATION FROM ELATE PROPERTIES TO REZONE APPROXIMATELY 3.9772 ACRES OF LAND IN THE SAINT ELIZABETH'S SUBDIVISION DESCRIBED AS BEING LOTS 23B, 24B & 25B OTHERWISE KNOWN AS 5910 BLACK OAK LANE IN RIVER OAKS, TARRANT COUNTY, TEXAS FROM A "C-F" COMMUNITY FACILITY DISTRICT TO A "PD-R4" PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT PURSUANT TO SECTION 18 "PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT" OF THE RIVER OAKS ZONING ORDINANCE #1286-2020 AS AMENDED MEETING R-4 SINGLE-FAMILY BASE REGULATIONS PURSUANT TO SECTION 11 OF THE RIVER OAKS ZONING ORDINANCE #1286-2020 AS AMENDED IN ORDER TO DEVELOP THE PROPERTY FOR SINGLE-FAMILY HOMES. (ZONING CASE #RZ 2021-0010-PD-R4).

At 7:35 p.m., Mayor Ashton opened the Public Hearing.

Heather Phelps and Juan Mancera with Elate Properties was present. A final presentation was presented to the council. The houses can be moved back depending on how it looks. All garages will have a split look. The price point has changed to \$400,000-\$450,000 because of the number of homes that had to be scaled back to allow for more yard room. All homes will be one story with brick/rock all the way around the houses.

## Citizen comments:

Ed Miller, 5901 Meandering-asked if some homes were going to be built to meet ADA compliance and asked where the sewer line is going to be installed. Juan Mancera-There is nothing in the documents requiring the homes to meet ADA compliance. Some things can be accommodated if purchased but all will have to be in the contract of sale. The 8" water main is on the left side and the 8" sewer line is on the right side.

Thomas Stocker, 732 Lynda-very concerned. There are several condemned homes in River Oaks, CISD ratings are not good, the closure of the Library, selling of bonds and concerned property taxes will increase which is hard on the elderly. Doesn't want to see this to pass just to fill a budget void. CM Claridge-the developer wanted to build more houses. Glad to fill a piece of property. Mayor Pro Tem Ashton-all of the properties that are substandard, the city has been working on these for years.

At 8:04 p.m., Mayor Ashton stepped out.

Charles Jerden, 6040 Walnut Drive-big concern is traffic and water drainage.

At 8:06 p.m., Mayor Ashton returned.

Mayor Pro Tem Houk-there are a lot of people moving into our area from out of state which is causing our property values to increase. There are partial facts and misunderstandings on social media. River Oaks freezes taxes for 65 years old and older.

At 8:11 p.m., Mayor Ashton closed the Public Hearing.

(ZONING CASE #RZ 2021-0010-PD-R4).

Concerns were addressed by the Planning & Zoning Commission. Property values may go up. This helps fund the Police Department, Fire Department, garbage pickup, etc. The Planning & Zoning Commission voted 3 to 1 to approve. Brad Gallman (Planning & Zoning Member) was present. The board voted to approve, and concerns were addressed.

Other developers want apartments which the citizens did not want. This proposed development is what is best for this piece of property.

CM Claridge moved, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Houk to approve Ordinance #1312-2021 with all exhibits and language be included in all documents. All voted "Aye".
