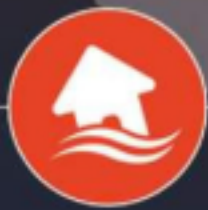

COMMON CODE VIOLATIONS

BUILDING MAINTENANCE

Siding, shingles and other exterior parts must be in good repair, interior walls, ceilings, floors and other structures must be in sound condition. Electrical, heating and plumbing fixtures must meet minimum standards.

FENCES

Approved fencing materials must be used and kept in good repair.

BUILDING NUMBERS & ADDRESSES

numbers must be placed in a position so as to be plainly visible from the road fronting the property.

OPEN STORAGE

Equipment, materials, or furnishings that would ordinarily not be used outdoors may not be stored outdoors.

JUNK, TRASH & DEBRIS

Such items are prohibited from being left in the yard and must be disposed of properly.

OVER GROWN WEEDS & GRASS

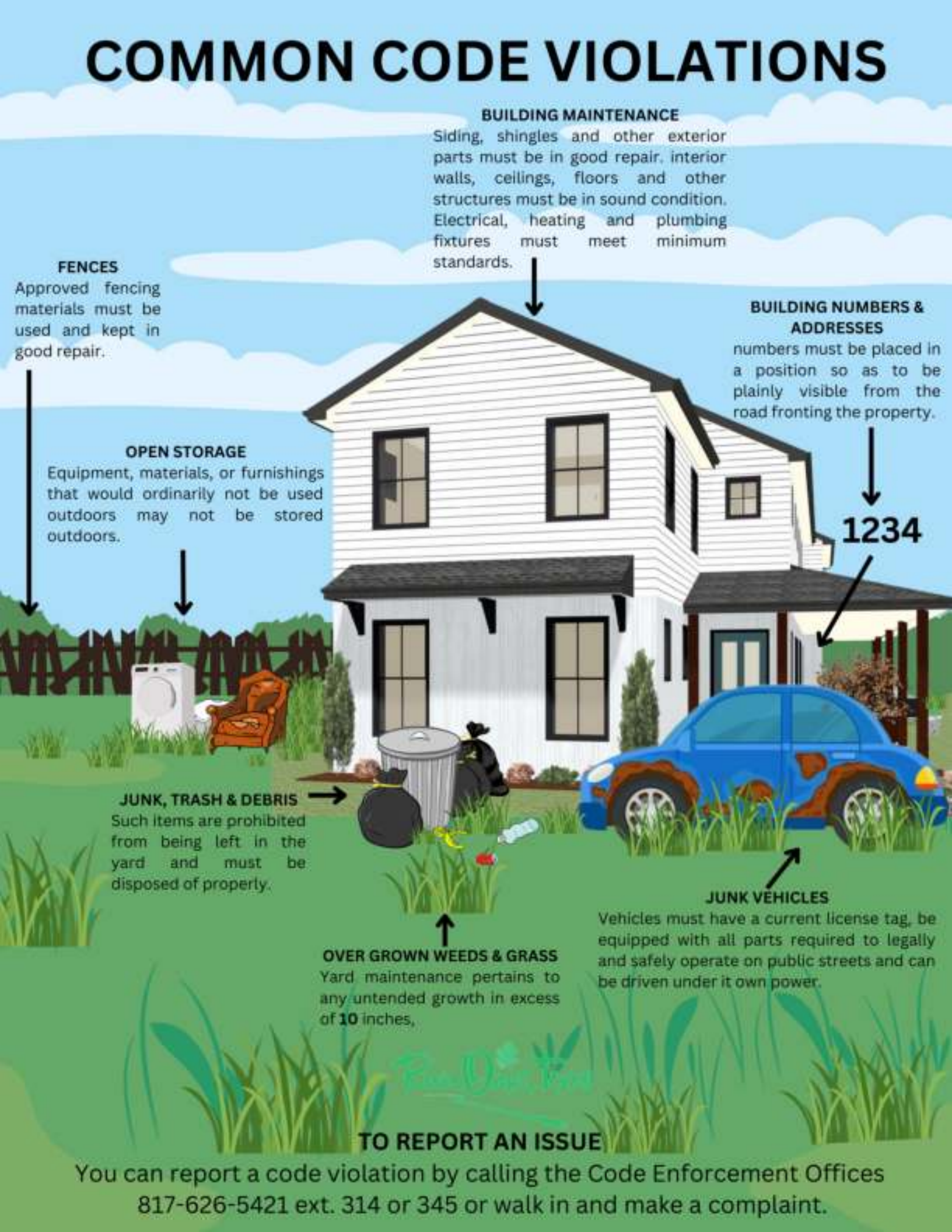
Yard maintenance pertains to any untended growth in excess of 10 inches,

JUNK VEHICLES

Vehicles must have a current license tag, be equipped with all parts required to legally and safely operate on public streets and can be driven under it own power.

TO REPORT AN ISSUE

You can report a code violation by calling the Code Enforcement Offices 817-626-5421 ext. 314 or 345 or walk in and make a complaint.



Be a Neat Neighbor

Being a neat neighbor by preventing code violations has many benefits:

- Helping to improve property values
- Making the streets, sidewalks, alleys and buildings safer
- Promoting health by eliminating unwanted trash, debris and vermin
- Avoiding potential citations, fees and fines

YARDS GONE WILD!!!

FACTS AT A GLANCE

- Lawns that have grass and weeds over 10 inches tall are in violation of the tall grass and weed ordinance.
- Tall grass is an indicator that no one lives there and is therefore inviting crime and vandalism opportunities.
- Rats, snakes and other animals that cause health issues can live in tall grass.

"Tall Grass & Weeds" is defined as grass, weeds, bushes, vines, poison ivy, poison oak, or any other foreign growth, other than trees, ornamental shrubbery, flowers and garden vegetables. Tall weeds detract from the appearance of the neighborhood. Undesirable wildlife like rats and mice use the unmown lawn for hiding places and habitat, and these animals may carry disease. Lastly, unmown grass may invite criminal activity.

COULD THERE BE A REASON YOUR NEIGHBOR HASN'T MOWED?

Neighbors don't always talk to other neighbors, but a little awareness of your neighbor's situation may go a long way toward a positive sense of community and the appearance of your neighborhood could very well benefit. Show compassion and understanding with neighbors where serious family illness or physical limitations are reasons for lawn neglect. These neighbors may also have an inability to pay someone to mow and no close family to help out. Think about the home where a spouse is on military assignment or where elderly neighbors cannot push a mower anymore. Look out for your neighbors and offer to mow their grass; arrange for other neighbors to take turns mowing, too. Neighbors helping each other will maintain appearance and foster a positive sense of community.

THIS WEEKS YARD SALES

You may have 4 yard sales a year, with a space after the first two sales.

Yard sale permits are \$10 each.

You must be on an active water account, in good standing at the yard sale address and must provide a valid United States issued photo ID with the yard sale address on it.
