

MOSQUITO FOGGING

With 2 samples testing positive this week, the City will be contracting for fogging both Friday and Saturday Nights starting at 10 P.M. as follows: Area 1 is all the area from Harvard east along a line across Roberts Cut Off to Greenbrier and south to north in the area east of Roberts Cut Off from River Oaks Blvd to the 5100 Block of Langley and on the west side of Roberts Cut Off from Meandering Road north to Purdue and also fogging Area 2 in all the area between Blackstone and Sam Calloway on the southern boundary of the city along the city boundary line in a westerly direction to its intersection at Sam Calloway and River Oaks Blvd and then along the line on River Oaks Blvd east to Roberts Cut Off , then south along the line on Roberts Cut Off to Barbara Road , then west on Barbara Road to Churchill and back south on Churchill to Blackstone Dr. These are not human cases.

Sales Tax Holiday Aug. 11 - 13, 2023

The Comptroller encourages all taxpayers to support Texas businesses while saving money on taxfree purchases of most clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks (sold for less than \$100) during the annual Tax-Free weekend. Qualifying items can be purchased tax free from a Texas store or from an online or catalog seller doing business in Texas. In most cases, you do not need to give the seller an exemption certificate to buy qualifying items tax free.

This year's sales tax holiday begins Friday, Aug. 11, and goes through midnight Sunday, Aug. 13.

The sales tax exemption applies only to qualifying items you buy during the sales tax holiday. Items you buy before or after the sales tax holiday do not qualify for exemption, and there is no tax refund available.

Qualifying Items

List of Clothing, Footwear and Other Items, List of School Supplies, Clothing and Footwear

Qualifying Items

During the sales tax holiday, you can buy most footwear and clothing (sold for less than \$100) tax free. You do not need to give the seller an exemption certificate.

The exemption applies to each eligible item sold for less than \$100, and there is no limit to the number of qualifying items you can buy.

For example, if you buy two shirts for \$80 each, each shirt qualifies for the exemption because each is less than \$100, even though the total purchase price is \$160.

Items That Do Not Qualify
The following items do not qualify for exemption during the sales tax holiday:

items sold for \$100 or more clothing subscription boxes

specially-designed athletic activity or protective-use clothing or footwear

For example, golf cleats and football pads are usually worn only when people play golf or football,

so they do not qualify for the exemption.

Tennis shoes, jogging suits and swimsuits, however, can be worn for other than athletic activity and qualify for the exemption.

clothing or footwear rentals, alterations (including embroidery) and cleaning services items used to make or repair clothing, such as fabric, thread, yarn, buttons, snaps, hooks and zippers, jewelry, handbags, purses, briefcases, luggage, umbrellas, wallets, watches and other accessories, computers, software, textbooks, certain baggage items, unspecified school supplies

RESIDENTIAL GARBAGE SERVICE ***UPDATES***



Residents are now able to purchase trash cans an put them at the curb on garbage days. All household garbage must be put either in plastic bags or boxes not exceeding 55 pounds in weight placed at the edge of the street or as an option in garbage cans placed at the edge of the street at the edge of the street not exceeding 32 gallons in size and must be removed from the street curb by 7:00 A.M. of the following day.



Due to the excessive summer heat, the city's residential garbage collection hours will be changing starting Wednesday, June 28th to start at 6:00 A.M. instead of the current 7:00 A.M. start time. We apologize for any inconvenience, but we have a responsibility to protect the health and safety of our employees.



All brush and tree limbs shall be limited to one (1) pile per lot on each residential customer account when stacked in a pile not exceeding twelve (12) feet in length, four (4) feet in width, and four (4) feet in height which are stacked neatly with the larger diameter of the limbs facing in one direction for easy handling and will be collected on Wednesday twice a month beginning Wednesday, August 2, 2023 as designated by the Public Works Director.
