Lions Demolish Eagles for First District Win

The Castleberry Lions were in search of their first district win. As were the Diamond Hill Eagles. The Eagles hosted the Lions at Handley Field on Friday, Oct. 6. It was a Homecoming crowd for Diamond Hill but it did not help as they were never really in this game. The Lions dominated from the onset, jumping out to a 20-7 lead in the first quarter and a 31-7 halftime lead. They cruised in the second half to a 52-19 victory.

The Lions took the opening kickoff and drove 65 yards in 12 plays for a touchdown. Key play, which kept the drive alive, was on fourth-and-4 from the Eagles 48-yard line. Junior quarterback Demetrius Valadez (#7) drew the Eagle defense offside to give the Lions a first down. Later, on a second-and-10 from the Eagle 12-yard line, Valadez (#7) connected with senior Riley Bentley (#11) for a touchdown. Junior kicker Chris Montoya's (#23) point-after-touchdown gave CHS a 7-0 lead (8:28/first).

The CHS defense forced Diamond Hill (continued on page 2)

into a three-and-out on their first series on offense. On fourth-and-4 from their own 25-yard line they got off a two-yard punt. The Lions set up on the Eagles 27-yard line. On fourth-and-4 for the Lions, Valadez (#7) found freshman Brian Cenicerros (#16) for a 21-yard touchdown reception. Two-point conversion attempt failed which left CHS with a 13-0 lead (5:30/first).

The Eagles second possession was full of penalties. Despite gaining 30 yards by penalties against CHS, the Lions eventually forced a fourth-and-14. However, the Eagles threw deep and their receiver made a great catch which resulted in 34-yard touchdown. The point-after-touchdown was good and with 2:03 left in the first quarter the Eagles trailed 13-7.

The Lions responded in five plays. After four runs by junior Cayden Perez (#6) netted 41 yards, CHS faced a third-and-5 from the Eagles 21-yard line. Valadez (#7) connected again with Bentley (#11) for a touchdown. Montoya's (#23) point-after-touchdown was good and the Lions led 20-7 (:35/first).

The Lions defense forced the Eagles into a punt on their following series. Back-to-back long runs by Perez (#6) of 35 and 36 yards helped put the Lions into scoring position again. On fourth down CHS settled for a 27-yard field goal by Montoya (#23). Lead increased to 23-7 (7:31/second).

Castleberry then forced another Eagle punt. Key defensive play was a third down sack of Diamond Hills quarterback by junior Ismael Cecenas (#45). The Eagles punt actually lost four yards and CHS began on the Eagles 34-yard line. On the next play Valadez (#7) completed his fourth throw of the night, for his fourth touchdown. It was Riley (#11) again, who took the short slant to the house for a 34-yard touchdown. Valadez (#7) threw to Cenicerros (#16) for the 2-point point-after-touchdown for a 31-7 lead (5:07/second).

The Lions defense forced the ball over on downs on the following possession. However, CHS failed to move the ball and punted for the first time in the game. Diamond Hill got the ball with 1:16 left until

half. They moved the ball to a first-and-goal from the Lions 6-yard line with 10 seconds left until half. But sophomore Nick Duran (#9) teamed up with Cecenas (#45) for a quarterback sack to end the first half with CHS leading 31-7.

Diamond Hill opened the second half with a nice drive, after a CHS pooch kick gave them excellent field position near midfield. They scored on a nine-play, 56-yard drive. The point-after-touchdown was missed and Eagles were left trailing 31-13 (9:14/third).

Again, CHS responded to an Eagle score with one of their own. They drove 76 yards in eight plays. Perez (#6) scored on a 4-yard touchdown run. Perez (#6) had a great night as he broke dozens of tackles throughout the evening. He finished the night with 28 carries for 276 yards. This touchdown, and the 2-point point-after-touchdown by a Valadez (#7) run pushed the lead to 39-13 (6:46/third).

After another turnover on downs forced by the Lion defense, CHS was on the move again. This 57-yard drive ended with a Va-

ladez (#7) 13-yard touchdown run. Montoya's (#23) point-after-touchdown made the score 46-13 (1:00/third).

The ensuing CHS pooch kick was recovered by Cenicerros (#16) and the Lions began at midfield. But CHS failed to move the ball and turned it over on downs.

The CHS defense the returned the favor and turned the Eagles over on downs. Perez (#6) got his second touchdown of the night on a 19-yard run. The point-after-touchdown was missed and the score was left 52-13 (6:25/fourth).

Diamond Hill returned the following CHS kickoff 72 yards to the Lions 25-yard line. They scored six plays later with 3:01 left in the game. This resulted in the final score of 52-19 for a Lions victory.

Castleberry returns home for their 2023 Homecoming Game this week!

The Lions (2-4/1-2) will face the Cougars from Western Hills (3-3/2-1) on Friday, Oct. 13.

Kickoff is at 7:30 p.m.

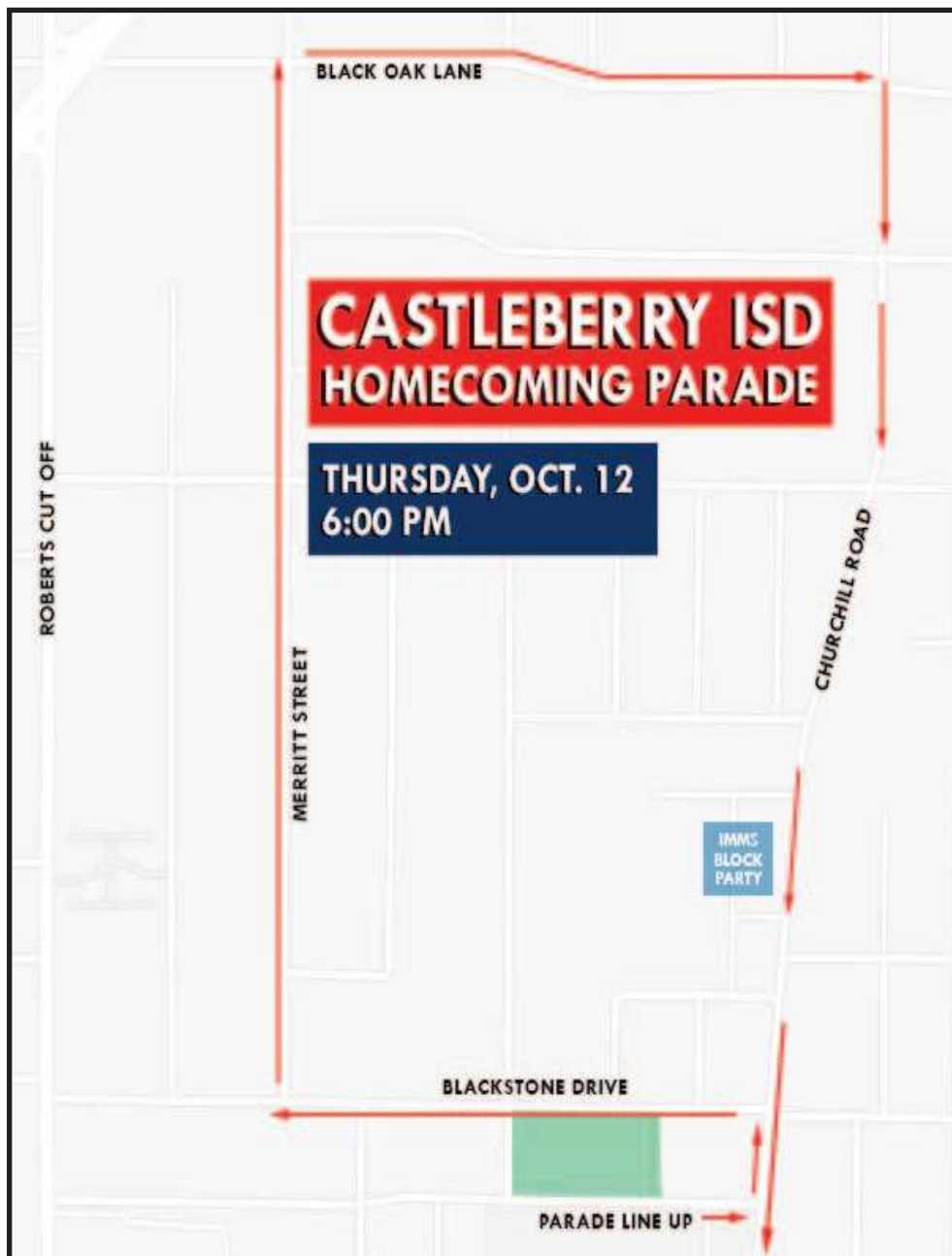
Varsity Football Game

Fort Worth Native, Actor Larry Hagman *by Dr. Ken Bridges*



Texas has produced many colorful characters and gifted actors and artists in its long history. Among those is actor **Larry Hagman**. He played one of the most notorious villains on TV but was the opposite off-screen, known instead for his wit and his devotion to friends.

Hagman was born in September 1931 in Fort Worth. His father, Benjamin Jackson Hagman, was an attorney and an accountant in nearby Weatherford, who later worked as a prosecuting attorney and was a decorated artillery officer during World War II.

His home life was difficult. In 1936, his mother, Mary Martin, was anxious to resume her career as a singer and stage actress and filed for divorce. For the next several years, Larry Hagman alternated between his mother and his grandmother while living in California. His mother sent him to a series of boarding schools before he went to live with her again in New York City after World War II. In 1946, he returned to Weatherford to live with his father and his new wife and half-brother.

He attended Weatherford High School and took several jobs. One summer, he worked for oilman Jess Hall, Jr., the owner of Antelope Tool Company. Hagman said he would later base his character of J.R. Ewing on memories of Hall. He graduated high school in 1949. His father encouraged him to become a lawyer, but Hagman instead pursued acting. He attended Bard College in New York City majoring in drama and dance but quit after one year.

Hagman acted in small stage productions

before he was drafted in 1952. He married Maj Axelsson in 1954, with whom he had two children. After four years in the air force, he returned to New York City and acted in a series of plays. His first TV appearance was a guest shot on the 1957 series *Decoy*. In 1958, he made three guest appearances on *Sea Hunt* with Lloyd Bridges.

He kept making small appearances on stage and screen, and his career steadily grew. From 1961 to 1963, he had a recurring role on the CBS soap opera *The Edge of Night*. His first film role was in 1964 in *Ensign Pulver*. Later that year, he appeared in the thriller *Failsafe*.

In 1965, he made a huge breakthrough with his career when he landed the lead in *I Dream of Jeannie*. Hagman played Maj. Tony Nelson, an astronaut who found a genie in a bottle on a deserted island. His character was often bewildered and overwhelmed by the antics of the genie played by Barbara Eden, who would become a lifelong friend. The popular series ran until 1970. After the end of the series, he appeared in two short-lived sitcoms, *The Good Life* (1971-1972) and *Here We Go Again* (1973).

He was looking for a new role in early 1978 when his wife suggested he read the script of a proposed new drama about a Texas oil family. Hagman immediately felt drawn to the scheming character of J.R. Ewing and got the role. When *Dallas* premiered in April 1978, it was an instant hit. "J.R." became a cultural icon, and millions tuned in every week to see his latest scheme and whether his co-star, Patrick Duffy, who played the younger brother Bobby Ewing, could thwart his plans. Many scenes were shot in and around the Dallas area, to the delight of Metroplex residents. In spite of his TV character, Hagman developed close relationships with all his fellow cast members.

The tensions in the Ewing family and the web of his backstabbing plans led to the famous "Who Shot J.R.?" cliffhanger in 1980, leaving millions wondering if he would survive the shooting and who was responsible. The question was the subject of interviews,

and magazine covers across the globe. In November 1980, in one of the most-watched episodes in television history, 83 million Americans tuned in to learn that he had survived and was shot by his sister-in-law and mistress.

The series lasted for 14 seasons. He was nominated for two Emmy Awards and four Golden Globe Awards. Hagman was the only actor to appear in all 357 episodes before the cancellation of *Dallas* in May 1991. He and other co-stars would appear in six TV movies in the years afterward. Hagman once said about his character, "It's fun to play the villain."

He would make brief film appearances, and directed a number of episodes of *In the Heat of the Night*, which starred his close friend Carroll O'Connor. But he faced a major health crisis in 1995. Hagman had been a heavy drinker for many years and had to undergo a liver transplant. The operation was a success, and he quit drinking. He wrote an autobiography, "*Hello Darlin*", in 2001. When his wife developed Alzheimer's Disease, he stayed by her side until her death in 2011.

In 2011, he was approached about a revival of *Dallas*. His first question was, "Are all my friends going to be there?" The revival premiered in 2012 with most of the surviving series originals and fared well in the ratings. However, Hagman was diagnosed with throat cancer. He received treatment while he worked on the series, and it initially seemed successful. However, a new cancer diagnosis was revealed in 2012.

Hagman died at a Dallas hospital in November 2012 at age 81.

How to Navigate Your Medicare Options During the Annual Enrollment Period

The average Medicare beneficiary in 2023 has access to 43 Medicare Advantage plans, the largest number of options ever, according to KFF. With so many plans to choose from, the Medicare and Prescription Drug Plan Annual Enrollment Period (AEP), taking place from Oct. 15 to Dec. 7, may be overwhelming and confusing.

“The Medicare Annual Enrollment Period is when you can shop for a new plan, if you want to,” says Kate Long, consumer financial wellness advocate at Assurance IQ.

As Long points out, shopping for a new plan doesn’t necessarily mean you cannot stay with the same carrier. They may have multiple plans available in your area. - The first tip is to review your Annual Notice of Change, which should have been mailed to you before Oct. 15. This document explains changes to your plan, such as providers, prescription drugs or services no longer covered. - Next, you’ll want to assess your healthcare needs and financial standing. Are there services you know that you’ll need in the coming year? If your finances have changed, can you still afford your current plan? Are you taking a new prescription that your current plan doesn’t cover?

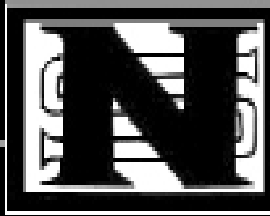
