## Smart Travel: How Families Can Vacation Across the U.S. on a Budget

Planning a family vacation can feel overwhelming, especially when the price tags for airfare, hotels and meals start to add up. But traveling inside the continental United States doesn't have to break the bank. With careful planning and a few creative strategies, families can take memorable trips that kids of all ages will enjoy — from toddlers to teens — without emptying their wallets.

### Save on Getting There: Driving vs. Flying

One of the biggest expenses for family travel is transportation. For groups of four or more, driving is often cheaper than flying, especially when factoring in baggage fees, airport transfers and rental cars. While gas prices can fluctuate, families who drive can pack their own food, avoid airline surcharges and make spontaneous stops along the way.

For longer distances where driving isn't practical, keep airfare affordable by setting flight alerts on budget sites, flying midweek, and using alternate airports. Booking flights three to six weeks in advance often yields the best fares. Families should also consider "open jaw" tickets — flying into one city and out of another — to save money and reduce travel time.

### Where to Sleep: Camping or Hotels?

Accommodations are the next major cost, and the choice often comes down to whether the family is comfortable camping. Camping fees at state or national parks usually run between \$15 and \$40 a night, a fraction of hotel rates. Many campgrounds also offer amenities like showers, laundry facilities and playgrounds. For kids, sleeping under the stars or roasting marshmallows over a campfire often becomes a vacation highlight.

For families who prefer a hotel bed, there are ways to keep costs low. Booking directly with a hotel chain's website sometimes results in discounts or perks like free breakfast. Apps such as HotelTonight or Priceline's "Express Deals" offer last-minute savings, and extended-stay hotels provide kitchens, which can cut food costs significantly. Traveling in the off-season or staying just outside a major tourist hub can also mean big savings.

Vacation rentals are another option, especially for larger families. A rental home with a kitchen not only saves on meals but also gives kids extra space to spread out.

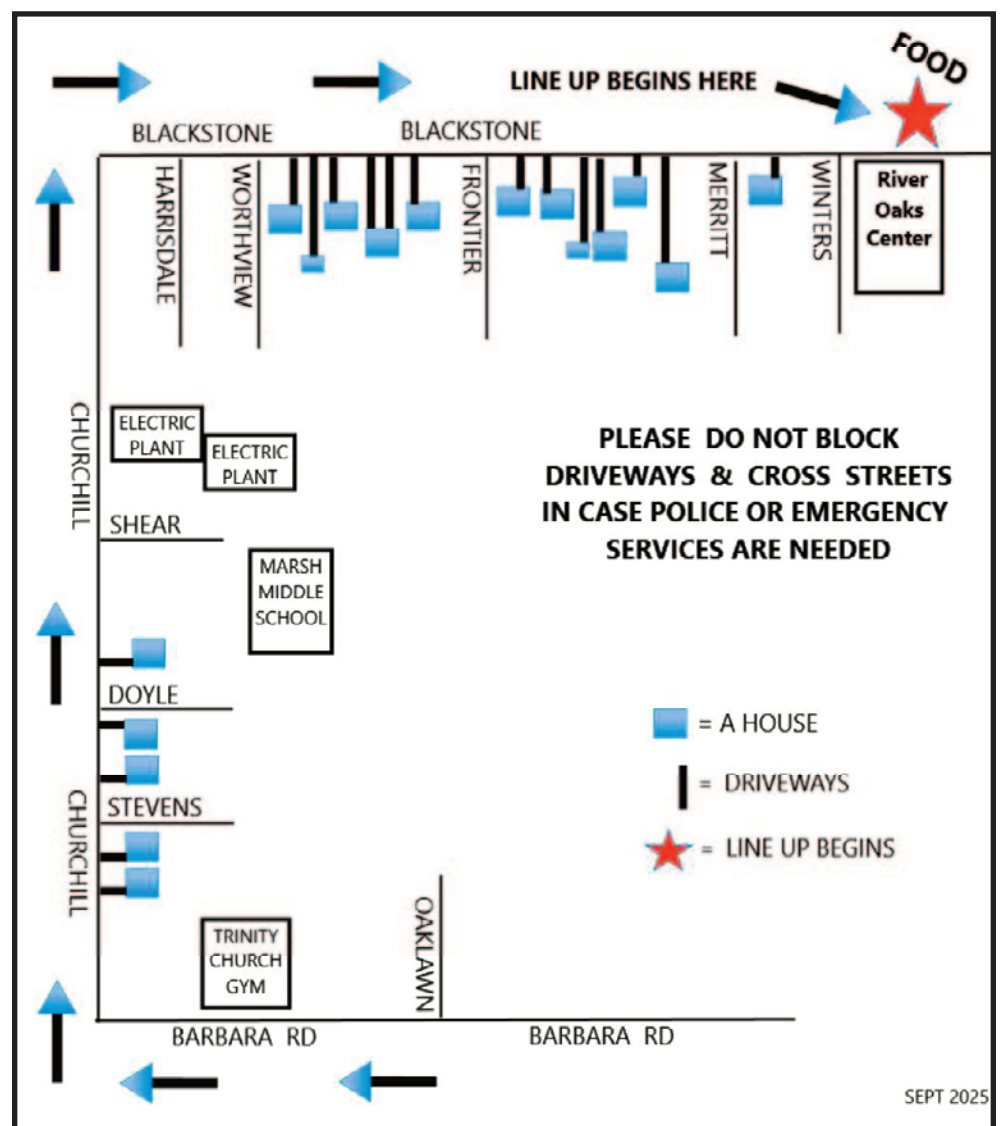
## Changes to Food Bank Route at River Oaks Event Center Starting Sept. 12

# Youth Sports Build Resilience and Unity as Little League World Series Showcases Global Connections

In the shadow of the Appalachian hills, Howard J. Lamade Stadium in Williamsport, PA glows with the energy of summer dreams coming true. At the 2025 Little League Baseball World Series, the lights shine especially bright on Lamar Little League, representing Richmond, TX, continuing a Lone Star State legacy of determination, resilience and youthful ambition.

For the third time in its history, Lamar has returned to Williamsport after charging through the Southwest Region with a 3–1 record, including a dramatic 5–2 victory over Louisiana’s Eastbank Little League to claim the crown . The team follows Texas representatives Needville (2023) and Boerne (2024).

Families from Richmond and beyond journeyed across states, some thousands of miles, to rally behind the boys in blue. Their presence turns every grounder and fly ball into a statement: this is more than sport. It’s community, pride, and personal growth.

On opening night, Lamar engaged in a pitcher’s duel of epic proportions with Fairfield National from Connecticut. Texas’s Shane Grawe struck out 11 over five stellar innings, but Fairfield found a single, scored in the fifth, and edged out a 1–0 victory.

Beyond the scoreboard, the benefits of youth organized sports are well-documented. A study published in PMC (National Institutes of Health) shows that team sports participation enhances adolescents’ ability to use emotion constructively, uplifting self-esteem and increasing life satisfaction, especially for those who internalize emotional intelligence through sports.

Another Swedish study captured in the British Journal of Sports Medicine found that each additional hour of physical activity at age 11 cut psychiatric diagnosis risk by about 12 percent, with boys seeing even greater reductions in depression (35 percent) and anxiety (21percent).

Team sports also foster belonging, empathy, and resilience, all skills Lamar’s players exhibit both on and off the field. At Williamsport,

amid international trees and the Grand Slam Parade, players from Texas and around the globe bond through shared routines, games and laughter.

For children at this age, the baseball diamond becomes both a classroom and a world stage. They learn to navigate high-pressure moments, celebrate successes and process disappointments. After all, earning to cope with wins and losses teaches resilience and emotional maturity, the hallmarks of future success.

At Lamade Stadium, the players’ experiences are enriched further by exposure to international peers, from Venezuela and Japan to Czechia and Aruba. This global stage offers cultural exchange and broadened perspectives in every handshake. It also builds confidence and self-awareness essential for young hearts & minds.

Back home, Texas has long fielded competitive Little League squads. Yet, despite 17 appearances from Houston-area teams, the state has won only twice, Houston squads in 1950 and 1966, with no championships since.

At that field far away from home, these Texas kids carry more than bats and gloves, they carry their families’ hopes, community support and a growing awareness of their own emotional strength.

As they walk off the field, the boys from Richmond will leave with more than memories. They carry the realization that through effort, sportsmanship, and camaraderie, they’ve become more than ball-players, they’ve become resilient, empathetic leaders.

budget-buster of family vacations, but they don't have to be. One of the easiest strategies is to make breakfast yourself. Stock up on cereal, oatmeal packets, fruit and yogurt at a local grocery store. A cooler in the car keeps milk, sandwich supplies and drinks cold during road trips.

Lunch can be as simple as picnic sandwiches in a park. Families who bring a small portable grill or electric skillet can prepare hot dogs, quesadillas or stir-fry at campsites or rental kitchens. # Significant Historical Events in America since 1800

1. April 30, 1803 – Louisiana Purchase. The U.S. purchased 828,000 square miles from France, doubling its size. This expansion fueled westward migration and the idea of Manifest Destiny.
2. June 18, 1812 – War of 1812 Begins. The U.S. declared war on Britain over trade restrictions and impressment of sailors. Though the war was indecisive, it strengthened American nationalism.
3. Dec. 2, 1823 – Monroe Doctrine Issued. President James Monroe declared the Western Hemisphere off-limits to European colonization. It became a cornerstone of U.S. foreign policy.
4. May 28, 1830 – Indian Removal Act Signed. This law forced Native Americans from their ancestral lands, leading to the Trail of Tears. It reshaped U.S. demographics and deepened injustice against Indigenous peoples.
5. March 6, 1836 – Battle of the Alamo. Texian defenders were defeated by Mexican forces, but the battle became a rallying cry for Texas independence and later U.S. expansion into the Southwest.
6. May 24, 1844 – First Telegraph Sent. Samuel Morse sent “What hath God wrought?” from Washington, D.C. to Baltimore. The telegraph revolutionized communication and commerce.
7. Jan. 24, 1848 – California Gold Rush Begins. Gold was discovered at Sutter’s Mill, sparking massive westward migration. California’s population boomed, and it entered the Union in 1850.
8. April 12, 1861 – Civil War Begins. Confederate forces fired on Fort Sumter, marking the start of the war over slavery and states’ rights. It remains America’s bloodiest conflict and ended slavery.
9. Jan. 1, 1863 – Emancipation Proclamation Issued. Abraham Lincoln declared enslaved people in Confederate states free. It redefined the war as a fight against slavery and paved the way for the 13th Amendment.
10. April 14, 1865 – Lincoln Assassinated. Lincoln was shot by John Wilkes Booth just days after the Civil War ended. His death complicated Reconstruction and healing between North and South.
11. Oct. 8, 1871 – Great Chicago Fire. A devastating fire destroyed much of Chicago. The city rebuilt rapidly, becoming a hub of modern architecture and urban planning.
12. Dec. 17, 1903 – Wright Brothers’ First Flight. Orville and Wilbur Wright achieved the first powered airplane flight in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina. It launched the age of aviation.
13. April 6, 1917 – U.S. Enters World War I. The U.S. declared war on Germany, tipping the balance for the Allies. It marked America’s emergence as a world power.
14. Oct. 29, 1929 – Stock Market Crash. The crash triggered the Great Depression, devastating the economy. It reshaped U.S. financial systems and led to Franklin D. Roosevelt’s New Deal reforms.
15. Dec. 7, 1941 – Attack on Pearl Harbor. Japan’s surprise attack killed more than 2,400 Americans. The U.S. entered World War II the next day, shifting global power permanently.
16. June 6, 1944 – D-Day Invasion. Allied forces landed in Normandy, France. American participation helped liberate Europe and established the U.S. as a dominant military power.
17. Aug. 6 & 9, 1945 – Atomic Bombs Dropped. The U.S. dropped bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, ending World War II. It ushered in the nuclear age and the Cold War.
18. May 17, 1954 – Brown v. Board of Education. The Supreme Court ruled school segregation unconstitutional. It energized the Civil Rights Movement and challenged Jim Crow laws.
19. July 2, 1964 – Civil Rights Act Signed. This landmark law banned segregation and discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex or national origin. It reshaped American society and law.
20. July 20, 1969 – Moon Landing. Apollo 11’s Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin became the first humans on the Moon. It marked U.S. technological leadership in the Space Race.
21. June 17, 1972 – Watergate Break-In. The scandal led to President Richard Nixon’s resignation in 1974. It reshaped public trust in government and reinforced checks on presidential power.
22. Sept. 11, 2001 – Terrorist Attacks. Hijacked planes struck the World Trade Center and Pentagon, killing nearly 3,000 people. It changed U.S. security, foreign policy, and led to wars in Afghanistan and Iraq.
23. Aug. 29, 2005 – Hurricane Katrina. The hurricane devastated New Orleans and the Gulf Coast. The disaster exposed weaknesses in disaster response and issues of inequality.
24. Nov. 4, 2008 – Barack Obama Elected President. Obama became the first African American president. His election symbolized racial progress and influenced debates on health care, foreign policy and identity.
25. March 11, 2020 – COVID-19 Declared Pandemic. The coronavirus outbreak transformed daily life with shutdowns, remote work and school, and over a million U.S. deaths. It reshaped public health policy and the economy.

# Pa Ferguson: The Only Texas Governor Impeached and Removed From Office

Pa Ferguson was one of the most controversial governors in the history of Texas. The consequences of his administration would be felt for years. As a result of his actions, in 1917, Ferguson became the only Texas governor impeached and removed from office.

James Edward Ferguson, also called “Farmer Jim” or “Pa,” was born in Bell County in 1871. His father died when he was four. He was kicked out of a local prep school, Salado College, at age 12 for misbehavior. He left home at 16, traveling and taking odd jobs until he returned to farm in Bell County. He became a lawyer in 1897, married Miriam A. Wallace in 1899, and expanded into real estate, insurance, and banking.

He was elected governor in 1914, his first election. He was a popular figure, signing laws protecting sharecroppers and providing state funding for rural schools. He was re-elected in 1916. Though he had signed legislation creating three new colleges, he found himself in a feud with professors at the University of Texas. Angry that two professors had openly criticized his administration, Ferguson demanded that the Board of Regents fire them. The Regents refused. In retaliation, Ferguson vetoed the entire appropriation for the university.

The fight with the university touched off a massive scandal. At the same time, officials had begun looking into Ferguson’s finances. A grand jury in Travis County learned that in 1915, Ferguson had transferred \$5,600 (more than \$164,000 in 2022 dollars) from the state to a bank in Austin and then to his bank in Temple that he used to pay off a private debt. In July 1917, he was indicted for misappropriation of funds. The legislature then came back into session to consider impeachment, an attempt Ferguson immediately condemned.

Impeachment under the modern Texas constitution is similar to the process at the federal level. The Texas constitution gives the lower house of the legislature power to impeach judges, the governor, and state-wide elected officials. Impeachment is the equivalent of an indictment. To impeach, the House simply needs a majority vote on the different charges involved. The House then chooses members to act as managers to present the case to the Senate for trial, essentially acting as prosecuting attorneys. Senators will then act as jurors while the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court presides over the proceedings. The Senate can call witnesses to testify and vote to convict with a two-thirds majority vote.

The entire process is substantially the same in most of the other states. Eight governors have been removed from office through impeachment. Oklahoma has impeached and removed two governors, and West Virginia impeached four members of its State Supreme Court at the same time in 2018. Early in 2022, the South Dakota attorney general was impeached after an alleged hit-and-run auto accident. Usually, officials accused of impeachable offenses resign before impeachment proceedings begin.

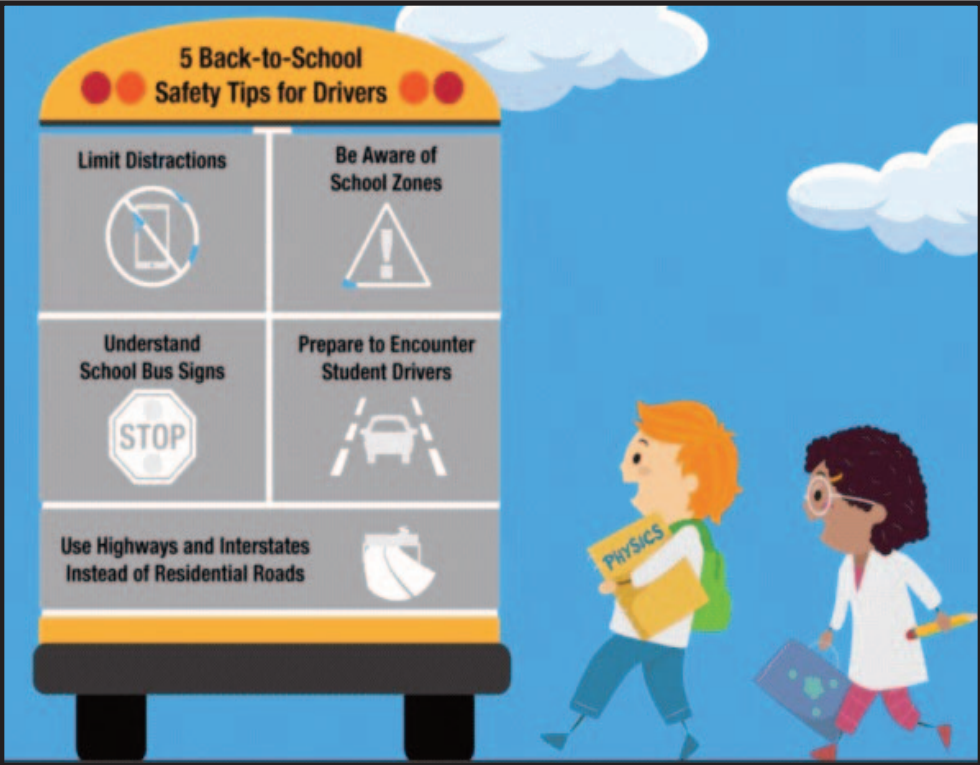
The framers considered impeachment an important check on the power of the presidency and against corruption. Fifteen federal judges and one cabinet official have been impeached by the House

since the ratification of the Constitution. Eight federal judges have been convicted in the Senate and removed from office. Though three presidents have been impeached, none have ever been removed from office.

With charges growing against Ferguson, the House of Representatives drew up 21 charges against him and voted to impeach. They then sent the charges to the State Senate for trial. The State Senate reduced the charges to ten, half of which dealt with the transfer of the \$5,600. Three others dealt with the veto of university funding as an abuse of power and official oppression. After a trial, the Senate - all Democrats -- voted him out of office by a vote of 25-3 and banned him from holding any state office.

Though he was kicked out of office and disgraced in front of his colleagues, Ferguson was still very popular among his hard-core supporters and rallied back. He never faced any criminal charges regarding his conduct. He started his own newspaper that fall, Ferguson Forum, to promote his views that the impeachment was illegitimate. Barred from state office, he ran for president in 1920 on the American Party ticket. He only made the ballot in Texas, winning just under 10% of the vote. He lost the 1922 Democratic Primary race for U. S. Senate by a wide margin. In 1924, his wife, Miriam “Ma” Ferguson won election as governor as a stand-in candidate in a tightly-contested race. His wife was defeated for re-election in 1926, following questions of improper use of her pardoning power. She would serve one more term as governor from 1933 to 1935. Ferguson convinced his wife to run one more time in 1940. Ma placed a distant fifth. The Fergusons retired from public life afterward with James Ferguson dying in 1944 with his wife passing away in 1961.

Though no Texas official has been impeached and removed from office at the state level since Ferguson, Texas politics has hardly been scandal-free. Scandals of all sorts, from the brazen to the bizarre, have occurred for decades at all levels.
