

# Medicaid and CHIP Help Families Access Mental Health Services for Kids

The state of mental health among youth continues to be of public concern. According to the latest Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Youth Risk Behavior Survey, youth mental health problems have increased significantly over the past decade, reaching an all-time high.

For instance, from 2011 to 2021, the rate of female high school students saying they feel sad or hopeless increased from 36 percent to 57 percent; for male students this rate increased from 21 percent to 29 percent.

Stressors at school, home or elsewhere can cause mental health disorders to arise, leading to negative impacts on how children learn and build relationships with others. If your child may need mental health support and doesn't currently have health coverage, you have options. Free or low-cost coverage through Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) offers many benefits, including doctor's visits, prescriptions, emergencies and the coverage of behavioral health services, including mental health services through pediatricians, mental health professionals, local community providers and organizations, as well as school systems. People who are pregnant or postpartum may also be eligible for this health coverage and mental and behavioral health services.

- Who qualifies for Medicaid or CHIP? Eligibility varies by state and is determined by how many people are in a household and household income. For instance, in most states, a family of four with household income up to \$60,000 per year may qualify for Medicaid, CHIP or both. To learn more about state-specific options, visit InsureKidsNow.gov or call 1-877-KIDS-NOW. Enrollment is open year-round.
- What if my child currently has Medicaid or CHIP coverage? Medicaid and CHIP coverage must be renewed annually. If you or your children have Medicaid or CHIP, it's time to pay attention to your health coverage. Keep an eye on the mail for renewal information from your state. When it comes, complete the forms and send them back right away. Failure or delay in responding can result in you losing coverage, even if you are eligible for Medicaid and CHIP. If you have lost coverage, go to HealthCare.gov to find quality plans and help paying costs.
- What types of services are covered through Medicaid and CHIP? To help care for all parts of a child's health, Medicaid and CHIP also cover routine health care visits, like preventive care, dental and vision checkups, specialist visits, physical, speech and occupational therapies, and emergency services. These programs also cover a wide range of mental health and substance use services such as counseling, peer support services, inpatient psychiatric services and case management services for needed medical, educational and social services. Services are covered through Medicaid for children and teens up to age 21 and through CHIP up to age 19.

States have flexibility to determine if services may be delivered using telehealth. These services are necessary to prevent, diagnose and treat a broad range of mental health symptoms and disorders, as well as substance use disorders.

Caring for mental health is caring for overall health. Early detection and intervention of mental health and substance use issues is crucial to the overall health of kids, teens and people during and after pregnancy, and may reduce or eliminate the effects of a condition if detected and treated early. Take the time today to explore coverage options through Medicaid and CHIP.

Consider these suggestions to conserve energy during extreme heat conditions.


- 1. Consider LED Lightning

## American Broadcast Journalist, Walter Cronkite by Dr. Ken Bridges

For years, he was considered to be the most trusted man in America.

Texan Walter **Cronkite** became the face of the news millions Americans as television news began to make its appearance and to make an impact on the nation's consciousness. As one of the most wellknown journalists in the nation, Cronkite helped guide television viewers through



the some of the most important news events of the 1960s and 1970s.

Cronkite was born in St. Joseph, Missouri, in 1916. His father was a dentist. He was interested in the news at an early age. While the family lived in Kansas City for a time, he had a job delivering newspapers. The family moved to Houston in 1926 where Cronkite had an active childhood with school and as a member of the Boy Scouts. His interest in journalism expanded while at San Jacinto High School when he became editor of the school newspaper.

In 1933, he enrolled at the University of Texas. He was very active at *The Daily Texan*, the university's own newspaper. At the same time, he also wrote part-time with *The Houston Post*.

In 1935, he left UT to take a full-time job writing for a wire service and for the now-defunct *Houston Press*. Shortly afterward, he became a radio announcer in Kansas City; and by 1937, he landed a job with the United Press wire service.

During World War II, he reported Nazi air raids over London, Allied invasions, and the progress of troops on the ground. After the war, he covered the Nuremberg war crimes trials. In 1950, famed journalist Edward R. Murrow convinced him to work for CBS News.

On April 9, 1962, Cronkite became the anchor for the 15-minute nightly news report by CBS, called simply Walter Cronkite with the News. In September 1963, the newscast was expanded to 30 minutes, the first to do so, and was rechristened the CBS Evening News. Cronkite marked the occasion with an interview with President John F. Kennedy on the broadcast. The nation grew to enjoy Cronkite's distinctive voice and broadcast style as he signed off each night's broadcast by declaring, "And that's the way it is."

He covered many tragedies. He later recalled how difficult it was to maintain his composure when reporting the death of Pres-

ident Kennedy in 1963. However, he was criticized for a 1968 report in which he stated that the U.S. should end the war in Vietnam.

Many advances in technology came during Cronkite's tenure. In 1965, the CBS Evening News first broadcast in color, a move that became permanent in 1966.

By the late 1960s, live interviews and reports from across the globe were broadcast by satellite. He was known for his attention to detail and his intense curiosity. He was widely respected by his colleagues and became a mentor of sorts for two other rising journalists and fellow Texans at CBS News, Dan Rather and Bob Schieffer.

He was overwhelmed by the developments in the American space program and excitedly reported the achievements of the space program and the Apollo moon landings. In appreciation for his support, NASA gave Cronkite a moon rock sample, which he in turn donated to the University of Texas.

In 1980, he announced he was stepping down as anchor of the CBS Evening News as CBS had a mandatory retirement age of 65 at that time. His final broadcast was in March 1981.

Though 65, Cronkite was far from ready to retire. Over the next two decades, he continued to host documentaries and programs for CBS and other networks. He wrote voraciously on current events with a nationally-syndicated column. He was an outspoken supporter of civil liberties issues as well as press freedom issues. In 1997, he published his autobiography, "A Reporter's Life."

Cronkite died in 2009 at age 92, celebrated across the nation for his achievements in journalism as a respected voice for unfolding world events.


