CISD Announces District Science Fair Award Winners

The Castleberry ISD 2021-2022 Science Fair was held virtually on Tuesday Jan. 25. During the Facebook Live broadcast, first, second, third, and grade level overall award recipients were announced. An overall champion was announced for elementary and secondary. All campus winners were recognized for participation in the science fair. The first place winner from each homeroom in grades 3-5, 41 students total, advanced to the District Science Fair. A committee of volunteers from Castleberry ISD's Teaching, Learning, and Innovation department judged each submission using an identified set of criteria.

Secondary students who placed first, second, third, grade level overall, and campus overall now advance to the [Fort Worth Regional Science and Engineering Science Fair](#) on Feb. 21.

The virtual event is hosted by University of Texas at Arlington. Regional winners will attend the State Fair in March 2022. National winner events are in summer and fall 2022.

Castleberry High School Health Occupations Students Place in Area Competition



Participants in Castleberry High School's HOSA: Future Health Professionals organization traveled to Killeen last weekend to participate in the Area 5 competition. Out of 10 competitors, three CHS students placed for the state competition in Galveston this April.

Kristin Flewelling, RN is the school's Health Science teacher and HOSA sponsor. "The competition is vigorous, and the organ-

ization sets the bar high with their expectations of our students in each event category," she said. "Each of my students diligently prepared for their competitions, often staying after school to practice their skills or research their selected topic for the contest. I am extremely proud of each of my students for their hard work, and excited to see my three state qualifiers compete again in April."

This is the organization's first year to compete in HOSA. "We have an incredibly tough area with expansive Health Science programs," said Stephanie Martinez, CTE Coordinator for Castleberry ISD. "It was exciting to see Castleberry students' names in first and second places over giant 5 & 6A schools with long established programs."

Recently, the Castleberry High School Health Science program has expanded with the addition of two separate national certification opportunities for Senior students: a Certified Billing and Coding Specialist (CBCS) course, and a Certified Patient Care Technician (CPCT) course. The high school has partnered with The National Healthcareer Association (NHA), the largest allied health certification agency in the United States, to provide CHS students with the knowledge and skills necessary to pass the national certification examination at the end of their Senior year. With successful completion of certification and high school graduation, students from CHS will be qualified to work in the health-care field as they pursue their desired careers.

HOSA or Health Occupations Students of America is an international leadership organization that allows students interested in pursuing a career in healthcare the opportunity to compete against their peers on a local (area), state, and international level.

Lady Lions Lose Close Match


The Castleberry girls soccer team faced Abilene Cooper at W.O. Barnes stadium on Jan. 28. The Lady Lions were hoping to avenge an earlier season loss to the Cougars on Jan. 7 while competing in the Richland Tournament. They lost that game 4-1 with senior Leslie Guereca scoring CHS's lone goal. Unfortunately, the Lady Lions could not overcome a first half deficit and lost 2-1.

During the first half it appeared that CHS was headed to a similar outcome as the first meeting between the two teams. The Cougars applied constant pressure on the Lady Lions. They spent the entire first half dominating the flow of the game. Castleberry spent most of the time playing defense. They were depending far too much on their senior goalie, Trinity Huerta (#00) to make plays. The Cougars had 17 shots on goal in the first half (compared to just six by the Lady Lions). Huerta defended nine of those shots. The first goal of the game came on a rebound off a shot initially defended by Huerta but then knocked in by another Cougar for a 1-0 lead (23:15/first half).

About 10 minutes later the same thing happened again. Huerta initially blocked a Cougar shot on goal but the rebound was again knocked in for Cooper's second goal of the evening at the 11:51 mark. The Cougars kept that 2-0 lead through to halftime.

As one sided the first half was – the second half was as well – except this time it was in the Lady Lions favor. It was CHS who kept the Cougars playing defense for most of the second half.

In the first three minutes of the second half, sophomore Viviana Mosqueda (#13) and senior Leslie Guereca (#10) got shots on goal, but both missed wide left.

Eventually, junior Elimar Mojica (#7), freshman Joselyn Salazar (#9), and Guereca also got shots on goal but they were either defend-

ed by the Cooper goalie or missed. Finally, at the 18:31 mark, with an assist from sophomore Lesly Martinez Vega (#25), Mojica got off a shot that got past the goalie and scored. Now the Lady Lions trailed just 2-1 and were right back in the game.

Despite getting three more shots on goal – one by Mosqueda (15:27) and two more by Guereca (6:25 & 2:47), the Lady Lions could not muster that game tying goal. The Cougars held on and the game ended with a 2-1 victory for Cooper.

The Lady Lions (now 4-8 on the year) return home on Friday, Feb. 4 to face Arlington Summit International Prep at 7:30 p.m. Summit will be playing their first game of the season. Go Lady Lions!
