

Castleberry Lions Football Season Ends in Midlothian

The Castleberry Lions traveled to Midlothian on Thursday, Nov. 12 to face the Midlothian Heritage Jaguars in the first round of the 4A UIL football playoffs. The Jaguars entered the game with a stellar 8-2 record. The Lions entered with a 3-5 record. Despite this, the Lions early on put up quite a fight. They went nose to nose with the superior Jaguars in the opening quarter. Finally, just before the first quarter ended Heritage scored to take a 7-0 lead. Unfortunately, after this it was like a dam had burst and the Lions simply could not hold back the flood, and eventually lost 70-7.

Castleberry received the opening kickoff but after gaining one first down was forced to punt. Senior Cristian Torres boomed a 51-yard punt to flip the field for the Lions. The Jaguars began on their own 18-yard line. On their third play from scrimmage, junior safety Jacob Campbell intercepted a tipped pass from the Heritage quarterback. This turnover gave the Lions great field position on the Jaguars 34-yard line. The Lions drove the ball for two first downs which resulted in a first-and-goal from the 6-yard line. However, on fourth-and-goal from the 2-yard line, senior quarterback Drew Aguillon was stopped short of the goal line by the Jaguars defense on the 1-yard line. Heritage took the ball over on downs. But the Lion defense forced the Jaguars to punt after gaining two first downs and CHS again got the ball back. The Lions had their troubles in this possession. A holding penalty and two incomplete passes appeared to have ended the drive, but a late hit by a

Jaguar gave the Lions new life with a first down following the 15-yard penalty. But after a fumbled snap, an incomplete pass and a sack the Lions were still forced to punt.

After this, Heritage began to find some success offensively. They marched 73 yards in five plays to take a 7-0 lead with just 23 seconds left in the first quarter. As the second quarter began the game began to unravel for the Lions. On their next series they attempted a fake punt on a fourth-and-five from their own 36-yard line but came up short. Heritage took just one play to score. This quickly made the score 14-0 (11:38/second). The lead grew shortly after as the Jaguars finished a five-play, 35-yard drive for its third touchdown in about three minutes (9:14/second) for a 21-0 lead.

Castleberry did mount a drive on their next possession. They began on their own 18-yard line. The Lions drove the ball 46 yards in 11 plays down to the Jaguars 36-yard line. But the Lions were having trouble protecting senior quarterback Drew Aguillon. He was sacked eight times in the first half. They surely missed their best lineman (both offensively and defensively), senior Charles Sanders who had been injured last week against Kennedale and did not suit up. The Lions failed to convert on fourth down and turned the ball over on downs. Heritage scored two plays later on a 36-yard touchdown pass to go up 28-0 (4:59/second). The Lions next two possessions resulted in one punt and another failed fourth down conversion. Both of these possessions were followed by touchdowns by the Jaguars. The second one took place with just 49 seconds left until halftime and resulted in a 42-0 lead.

The third quarter was not much better for the Lions. The Jaguars scored three more touchdowns and entered the fourth quarter with a 63-0 lead. The Lions offensive bright spot took place in their first drive of the fourth quarter. They began on their own 19-yard line. The drive included some nice runs by junior running back Juan Cano, and completions to senior George Oviedo and Lonnie Adams. On a second-and-two, Aguillon took off on a run, broke several tackles, reversed his field and ran 29 yards for a touchdown. Torres' point-after-touchdown was good and the Lions avoided the shutout. Heritage would score one more time to make the final score 70-7.

Despite this ending, the Castleberry Lions have much to be proud of this season. In a year that has nothing in our history to compare to, the Lions fought hard every game. They made the playoffs for the second straight year, an achievement that had not take place in over 25 years!

Congratulations to Head Coach Juan Silva and his staff and especially the seniors on this team! We are proud of you!

She will be remembered as a selfless and






