#### CALL TO ORDER

With a quorum present, Mayor Earwood called the Regular Meeting of the River Oaks City Council to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 25, 2014 at the River Oaks City Hall, 4900 River Oaks Blvd., River Oaks, Texas 76114.

# PERSONAL APPEARANCES AND ITEMS REQUIRING COUNCIL APPROVAL/ACTION:

7. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF REQUEST BY STEPHEN WESTBROOK AT 1211 HARVARD PURSUANT TO SECTION 21.C3ai OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE IN ORDER TO LOCATE A 6-FOOT ORNAMENTAL FENCE IN FRONT OF THE BUILDING LINE IN A RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICT.

Steve Westbrook, property owner, requested to install a wrought iron fence in front of the house, 45 feet from the street in an L-shape toward the side of the property.

CM Crews moved, seconded by CM Ashton, to approve the fence. All voted "Aye."

8. CONSIDER APPROVAL TO RE-NAME THE RIVER OAKS COMMUNITY CENTER IN ORDER TO ENCOURAGE AND PROMOTE MORE PARTICIPATION FOR DIVERSE FORMS OF USE OF THE FACILITY.

Shirley Wheat and Shirley Bloomfield suggested changing the name of the Community Center to The River Oaks Event Center in order to add appeal and diversity.

CM Butler moved, seconded by CM Crews, not to change the name and leave the name River Oaks Community Center. CM Butler, CM Holland, and CM Crews voted "Aye." CM Ashton and Mayor Pro Tem Gordon voted "Nay."

9. CONSIDER APPROVAL TO HOLD A BLOOD DRIVE WITH CARTER BLOOD BANK IN THE CITY HALL PARKING LOT.

CS Gregory presented the option to hold a blood drive at City Hall on Monday, June 23, 2014 from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon in the parking lot in front of the library.

Mayor Pro Tem Gordon moved, seconded by CM Butler, to approve a blood drive with Carter Blood Bank at City Hall. All voted "Aye."

# **PUBLIC HEARINGS / ACTION FROM PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

10. **PUBLIC HEARING:** IN ORDER TO RECEIVE CITIZEN COMMENTS ON SUBSTANDARD ENFORCEMENT ACTION REGARDING STRUCTURE(S) LOCATED ON THE PROPERTY AT **5516 NORTH SCHILDER.** 

At 7:32 p.m. Mayor Earwood opened the public hearing.

A representative for the property was not present.

CCO Jones showed photos and cited structural, electrical, plumbing, and mechanical violations. Jones reported work being done without proper permitting. Jones explained that the property had been under remodel since December 2011 and remains unfinished. Jones pointed out

multiple code violations including storage, junk and debris and junked vehicles. CA Elam suggested issuing citations for the code violations by certified mail.

At 7:57 p.m. Mayor Earwood closed the public hearing.

11. **ACTION FROM PUBLIC HEARING:** CONSIDER COUNCIL ORDERS ON THE PROPERTY AT **5516 NORTH SCHILDER** THAT MAY INCLUDE SECURING, VACATING OF OCCUPANTS, REMOVAL, REPAIRING OR DEMOLITION OF STRUCTURE(S) OR ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION IMPLORING A FEDERAL AGENCY TO ABATE ALL SUBSTANDARD VIOLATIONS IN ORDER TO BE BROUGHT INTO COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 3.07.004 OF THE RIVER OAKS CODE OF ORDINANCES (2006) AS AMENDED.

No action was taken.

## **OTHER ITEMS REQUIRING COUNCIL ACTION:**

12. CONSIDER APPROVAL TO AMEND THE SUBSTANDARD BUILDING ORDER AT 933 CARONDOLET AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED ON JANUARY 14, 2014 FOR 60-DAYS.

A representative for the property was not present.

CCO Jones reported that the substandard fee has not been paid. Jones added that no inspections have been performed on the electrical permit. CA Elam suggested an administrative hearing to assess civil penalties.

#### No action was taken.

13. DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION ON THE MARCH 26, 2013 SUBSTANDARD BUILDING ORDER AT 604 FRONTIER STREET INCLUDING CIVIL PENALTIES AS WAS ASSESSED ON AUGUST 27, 2013 AGAINST THE PROPERTY OWNER AT **604 FRONTIER STREET** FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH AN ORDER ISSUED BY THE BOARD PURSUANT TO <u>SECTION</u> 3.07.007 OF THE RIVER OAKS CODE OF ORDINANCES (2006).

It was noted that Staff had received a document from the bank stating that they are not the owner and therefore do not have the authority to abate the violations. CCO Jones showed photos that were taken when an administrative warrant was served. Jones cited electrical and plumbing violations that remain. CA Elam suggested increasing the administrative penalties.

Mayor Pro Tem Gordon moved, seconded by CM Ashton, to increase the civil penalties on 604 Frontier from \$10 per day to \$250 per day effective March 26, 2014. All voted "Aye."

## ORDINANCES / RESOLUTIONS REQUIRING COUNCIL APPROVAL/ACTION:

14. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF **RESOLUTION # 793-2014** AMENDING RESOLUTION 779-2013 THAT ADOPTED SOLID WASTE COLLECTION RATES FOR COMMERCIAL DUMPSTERS BY INCORPORATING CHARGES FOR LOCKS AND CASTERS.

CS Gregory explained that the proposed resolution adds the cost of casters and locks to the current rate schedule.

Mayor Pro Tem Gordon moved, seconded by CM Butler, to approve Resolution #793-2014. All voted "Aye."

- 15. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF **ORDINANCE # 1022-2014** ENACTING REASONABLE REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE TIME, PLACE AND METHOD OF ELECTIONEERING OUTSIDE THE 100-FOOT DISTANCE MARKERS OF PUBLIC POLLING PLACES.
- CS Gregory stated that the proposed ordinance would create a "reasonable regulation" designating the place, time and manner of electioneering. CA Elam added that the ordinance allows for parking in certain areas but those areas are not reserved for electioneering. Concerns were mentioned related to signs on city hall buildings and the possibility of damage to the sprinkler heads in the grassy area.

Mayor Pro Tem Gordon moved, seconded by CM Crews, to approve Ordinance #1022-2014 with the additions of a liability clause for damage to City property and a prohibition on affixing signs to City walls. All voted "Aye."

CCO Jones reported consistent contact with the property representatives. Jones stated that the demo is planned once Atmos removes the gas meter.

- 5100 ALMENA Staff has requested some changes to the restoration plans for this burnout. A permit for a partial demo has been issued.
