AGENDA

- 1. Call to Order at 6:32 by CHAIRMAN- Hub Makarwich
- 2. Member Roll Call: (Makarwich, Ballard, Ashton, Vandiver, Warriner, Brooks).
- 3. Approved Minutes from Meeting on August 1, 2013.

Chairman Makarwich approved the minutes and Jimmy Warriner - seconded the motion. All –Aye- minutes approved.

- 4. Report from Council Liaison Joe Ashton:
 - a. Joe stated that at the last City Council meeting, they discussed security measures for the Parks as well, as the security needed for City Buildings. Council would like to review bids and information concerning installing the security cameras as all City/Park locations should be monitored by the same Company.
 - b. After obtaining the information needed, the City and Parks Board will then determine the responsibility of the monitoring of the cameras.

- 5. Daniel McLean requesting Parks Board support in Promoting a Skateboard Competion at Wooldridge Park.
 - a. Daniel did not attend the Meeting.
- 6. Update on Security Cameras for McGee and Wooldridge Parks:
 - a. David Ballard mentioned that the price of the security cameras is approximately \$26,000.00. There is approximately \$3,000- \$4,000 worth of charges annually for repairs due to vandalism, theft, etc. These cameras would be a very large investment. David pointed out the possibility that we could test using some less expensive hardware, before deciding on the security system. The City council would be notified in advance for their authorization regarding the investment/installation of the motion sensor lights and other types of infrared/hunting cameras at Wooldridge Park. The infrared Security cameras cost \$99.00 to \$600.00 each. Motion lights are 32.00 each. A two pack of bulbs = \$10.00.
 - We would need to buy the covers for these bulbs.
 - b. With the installation of the hunting type of cameras, we would be able to assess the timeframes involved on any criminal mischief. We would notify the Police Dept to schedule patrol at certain times.
- 7. Update on damage to Heritage Park from the August 30th accident as presented by PWD James Hatley.
 - a. A Citizen had a blackout while driving North on Roberts Cut-off and his car swerved out of control. He is alright. His friend that saw this accident happen, returned while the Police Dept., Hub, James M., James H., were on site surveying the damage and explained to them what had happened and provided the man's insurance information.
 - b. James Hatley is obtaining 3 quotes for the repair/replacement of some of the fencing, the electrical panel, gazebo, timer for water sprinklers, etc.
- 8. Discussion and/or Action on Signs for rules at McGee Park:
 - a. James Hatley took multiple pictures of signs in nearby Parks and provided copies of the signs and the verbiage to the Parks Board
- 9. Updates on building maintenance requests:
 - a. Jimmy and Hub had recently noticed the east ramp damage at Wooldridge that James Hatley had recently reported to the Parks Board- This ramp has been damaged and repaired twice and to replace the parts it would cost would be \$600.00.
 - b. Jimmy said he would check the damage and try to repair the ramp if possible.
 - c. Wooldridge Park- the drainage is washed out and has been holding water. Jimmy advised it would be a good idea to pour some cement on the rocks and this would resolve the drainage issue.
- 10. Committee Reports: Discussion of any and all matters relating to all Park Properties.

Heritage Park:

- a. James Hatley will provide updates regarding the repairs of the Park due to the 8/30 accident.
- b. James H. mentioned that it would be a great idea to add lighting for the illumination of the Brick "Welcome to River Oaks" sign in the evenings.

Lion Triangle:

Note: We still need to replace the dead bushes that were dug up recently. We need to determine what type of bushes should be planted? Vote on type of new bushes and to obtain and plant the new bushes. David, Vice- Chair reports that the landscaping looks like a Jack o 'lantern and it is not Halloween. James Myrick will check Garden books to confirm what drought resistant, evergreen plants would be available and will present this information at the next meeting.
