1. CALL TO ORDER

With a quorum present, Mayor Earwood called the Regular Meeting of the River Oaks City Council to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 28, 2015 at the River Oaks City Hall, 4900 River Oaks Blvd., River Oaks, Texas 76114.

INVOCATION

PWD Hatley delivered the Invocation.

PWD Hatley led the Pledges of Allegiance to the United States and the Texas Flags.

7. PROCLAIMING EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES WEEK, MAY $17^{TH}-23^{RD}$ AND ANNUAL MEDSTAR UPDATE AS PRESENTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Mayor Earwood read a proclamation declaring May 17th – May 23rd as Emergency Medical Services Week.

Brett Lyle and Doug Hooten presented the annual MedStar update including a revision to the deployment plan, an upgrade to the radio system, service enhancements, the new headquarters facility, and the new Medical Director, Dr. Neal Richmond.

At the request of Mayor Pro Tem Holland, Ms. Lyle summarized the Star Saver program.

- 8. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH PAYMENT GROUP, LLC AND ITS DIVISION TRAFFIC PAYMENT.COM IN ORDER TO PROVIDE TELEPHONE CITATION PAYMENT SERVICES AND ONLINE CITATION PAYMENT SERVICES
- CS Gregory requested to enter into an agreement with trafficpayment.com for the receipt of court payments. The program interfaces with the current Incode system and is at no cost to the City. CS Gregory reported that this company also provides a telephone number for customers who prefer to call. CS Gregory stated that no notice is required to terminate the agreement with the current provider, RevTrak. CS Gregory suggested beginning with court and possibly expanding to utility billing if successful.

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Gordon, to approve the service agreement with Payment Group, LLC and its division trafficpayment.com in order to provide telephone citation payment services and online citation payment services. All voted "Ave."

9. CONSIDER APPROVAL TO RE-ISSUE BUILDING PERMIT FOR ALBINO GUTIERREZ AT 5104 LANGLEY THAT EXPIRED ON MARCH 27, 2015 DUE TO FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH SECTION 105.5 OF THE 2012 INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE AS ADOPTED

Albino Gutierrez was present with Ramon Gutierrez who translated for him.

Inspector Sanders explained that the expired permit to extend the front of the house has been renewed twice by Staff. Sanders added that staff has issued a stop work order for additional work which was not originally permitted and was not properly inspected prior to pouring the concrete. Sanders stated that the applicant would also like to add a roof to the permit.

It was explained to Mr. Gutierrez that permits have an expiration date. Mr. Gutierrez stated that he is doing the work himself and has been unable to complete the work within that time. Mr. Gutierrez requested one week to complete the siding which will complete the original permit.

Sanders requested that the concrete work performed without a permit or inspections be certified by an engineer or removed. Mr. Gutierrez presented photos on a phone that were taken during the construction process. Inspector Sanders was satisfied with the photos and agreed to sign off on the concrete work if the photos could be put into the file.

Mr. Gutierrez agreed to finish the current project and return for an additional permit for the roof. Council members encourage Mr. Gutierrez to complete the projects in a timely manner and to call for inspections.

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Scott, to reissue the building permit for Mr. Gutierrez at 5104 Langley that expired on March 27, 2015 be extended and completed in 30-days from today. All voted "Aye."

10. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF REQUEST BY THE COMMUNITY CENTER CO-DIRECTORS TO HOLD A CITY SPONSORED CAR SHOW IN THE FALL

Community Center Directors Wheat and Bloomfield requested to hold a car show in the fall of 2015 at the Community Center in coordination with D & D Rockin Rods. The car show would include a craft fair inside the center.

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Gordon, to approve the request for a city sponsored car show in the fall. All voted "Aye."

CM Gordon made the following motion "I move that the City Council find that the building located at 1705 Long Ave. based on evidence presented at this hearing, is Substandard and: 1) That the conditions set forth in the Building Official's report exist to the extent that the life, health, property, or safety of the public (and occupants of the building(s), if applicable) are endangered; and 2) That the building(s) is/ are feasible of repair and therefore ORDER the Building to be repaired BY THE OWNER within 89 days and the LIENHOLDER OR MORTGAGEE to within an additional 30-days if the owner does not comply; and 3) THE BOARD ORDERS commencement of the repairs within 30-days and has established specific time schedules with the OWNER or MORTGAGEE for the repair; and 4) ORDER that the building be repaired in conformance with the requirements of Section 3.07.004 of the River Oaks Code of Ordinances (2006) as amended or demolished by the Owner and the debris removed within 89 days or by the Lienholder or Mortgagee to within an additional 30-days if the Owner does not comply and further find that if the building is not repaired within 89 days, that there is no reasonable probability that the building will be repaired within a reasonable period of time if additional time is given. If the building is not repaired within 89 days in full conformance with Section 3.07.004 of the River Oaks Code of Ordinances (2006), the building shall be demolished. 5) Order that substandard fee of \$150.00 be paid upon permit issuance. Certificate of Occupancy will not be finaled until all substandard fees are paid in full. CM Ashton seconded the motion. All voted "Aye."

If the building is not repaired within 89 days in full conformance with Section 3.07.004 of the River Oaks Code of Ordinances (2006), the building shall be demolished. 5) Order that substandard fee of \$150.00 be paid upon permit issuance. Certificate of Occupancy will not be finaled until all substandard fees are paid in full. CM Gordon seconded the motion. All voted "Aye."
