10. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF CHANGE ORDER NUMBER 1 FOR THE SANITARY SEWER COLLECTION SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS PHASE 3 PROJECT NUMBER TWDB CWSRF #73749.

This was brought up in a previous meeting. This change order is to relocate the 18" sewer main away from the apartment complex. The change order is for \$73,165.00.

Mayor Pro Tem Houk moved, seconded by CM Claridge to approve Change Order Number 1. All voted "Aye".

Mayor Pro Tem Houk moved, seconded by CM Claridge to approve Resolution #1067-2021. All voted "Aye".

13. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION #1068-2021 AUTHORIZING THE CASTING OF THE CITY OF RIVER OAKS ALLOCATED VOTES FOR APPOINTMENT ON THE TARRANT APPRAISAL DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
