1. CALL TO ORDER

With a quorum present, Mayor Earwood called the Regular Meeting of the River Oaks City Council to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 23, 2016 at the River Oaks City Hall, 4900 River Oaks Blvd., River Oaks, Texas 76114.

Mayor Pro Tem Holland delivered the Invocation.

Ross Vaughan, 1709 Melba, requested another 60-day extension due to other financial obligations. BI Sanders supported the extension.

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Gordon, per staff request to approve the request for an extension to upgrade the electrical at 1709 Melba Court for 60 days. All voted "Aye."

Reid Satori, representative for the Owner — Window Rock, requested 60-days to bring the property into compliance. BI Sanders reported that workers were stopped today and told to obtain permits. Mayor Earwood suggested that a plan of action be presented to and approved by CS Gregory prior to the issuance of any permits. CA Elam requested that the order be amended to include the correct record owner as indicated by Mr. Satori.

Mayor Pro Tem Holland moved, seconded by CM Butler, to extend the order 60-days as requested contingent on CS Gregory approval of a plan of action and to change the name to Window Rock. All voted "Aye."

At 7:16 p.m. the public hearing was opened.

Legal counsel for Family Dollar was present and requested the requirement for a screening fence be waived since Family Dollar does not own the property and has no authority to construct a fence.

Tommy Miller, District Manager for Family Dollar, presented pictures of the area behind the Family Dollar store stating that there is no feasible location to construct a fence. Mr. Miller stated that all deliveries of beer and wine will go through the front entrance of the store. The attorney for Family Dollar confirmed that alcoholic beverages would take up 1-2 coolers and would remain at less than 30% of total sales.

At 7:25 p.m. the public hearing was closed.

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Butler, to approve the application for a specific use permit at 5514 River Oaks Boulevard Family Dollar Store #3127 for the sale of alcoholic beverages – beer and wine – in accordance with Section 23A.G.3.J for off-premise consumption pursuant to Zoning Ordinance 1060-2015 as adopted and as amended with the provision to waive the fence requirement and to look at revising that requirement in the future. CM Butler, CM Scott, CM Ashton and CM Gordon voted "Aye." Mayor Pro Tem Holland voted "Nay." Motion passed.

At 7:28 p.m. the public hearing was opened.

Mayor Pro Tem Holland mentioned special setback provisions for corner properties and requested Mr. Istook take that into consideration. Mr. Istook confirmed he could build on the corner lot and comply with the setback requirements.

FC Shelley responded to an inquiry, stating that the new fire truck is in cue for manufacturing which should begin next month.

PC Carter mentioned the virtual shooter training on March 18 and 19, 2016.

Cecilia Thompson and her son, 5140 Crown Road, expressed concern that the skate park is closing. They started a petition and collected signatures, mostly from middle school students. Mayor Earwood explained that the skate park was temporarily closed due to some safety concerns but it is back open.

James Myrick stated that FEMA will be performing a test on March 20 that may send an alert to mobile phones.

CS Gregory reported that StreetCred has produced significant revenue since taking over the warrant collections.

CS Gregory responded to an inquiry, stating that the Community Center report is being reformatted.
