CALL TO ORDER

With a quorum present, Mayor Herman Earwood called the Regular Meeting of the River Oaks City Council to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 13, 2018 at the River Oaks City Hall, 4900 River Oaks Blvd., River Oaks, Texas 76114.

2. INVOCATION

CM Scott delivered the Invocation.

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO UNITED STATES FLAG AND THE TEXAS FLAG

CM Scott led the Pledges of Allegiance to the United States and the Texas Flags.

Mayor Earwood asked all firemen in the audience to stand.

At 7:03 p.m., Mayor Earwood went into Executive Session under Section 551.074.

At 7:09 p.m., Mayor Earwood reconvened back into Regular Session.

ACTION FROM EXECUTIVE SESSION:

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Scott to appoint Greg Stockton as the River Oaks Fire Chief with a salary of \$27,327.82. All voted "Aye".

Chief Stockton gave a Special Presentation (name plaque and fire helmet) to Ex Fire Chief James Brown.

PERSONAL APPEARANCES AND ITEMS REQUIRING COUNCIL APPROVAL/ACTION:

7. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF REQUEST BY DANIEL ENRIQUEZ AT 1717 LONG FOR WATER BILL ADJUSTMENT DUE TO WATER LEAK.

Daniel Enriquez was present. He was out of town for several months. The September consumption was 6,215 cubic feet. The Water Department went by policy and put a door tag on his door notifying him of a possible leak unaware the customer was out of town. The next month (October) was even higher at 16,407 cubic feet. At this time, the Water Department turned his water off. Customer came back into town and found a leak in a toilet and fixed it. Mr. Enriquez is requesting a water bill adjustment due to the leak.

CM Scott moved, seconded by CM Chisholm to approve the adjustment by averaging the past 12 months on water only and adding 10%. CM Scott, CM Chisholm and CM Ashton voted "Aye". CM Butler voted "Nay". Motion passed.

8. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF REQUEST BY ANGELICA GARCIA AT 5067 RIVER OAKS BLVD FOR WATER BILL ADJUSTMENT DUE TO WATER LEAK.

Angelica Garcia was present. There was a leak at the meter but was unknown because of the rain. Once it stopped raining, the leak was noticeable and was fixed.

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Scott to approve the adjustment by averaging the past 12 months including sewer and adding 10%. CM Scott, CM Chisholm and CM Ashton voted "Aye". CM Butler voted "Nay". Motion passed.

9. DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION FROM PRESENTATION BY DAN KESSLER OF NCTCOG & PROJECT DESIGN ENGINEERS ON THE MEANDERING ROAD PROJECT.

Dan Kessler with North Central Texas Council of Governments was present; Clint Hoover, Project Manager and Jay Vonahsen with the City of Fort Worth were present; and Jill Van Howeyk and Eric Greenman both with Lamb-Star were present and all went over the Meandering Road project and presented a slideshow. Next presentation will be at the January 2019 Community Forum Meeting.

PUBLIC HEARINGS/ACTION FROM PUBLIC HEARINGS:

10. PUBLIC HEARING: TO RECEIVE PUBLIC INPUT ON THE CREATION OF A REINVESTMENT ZONE AND ITS BENEFITS TO THE CITY OF RIVER OAKS AND TO PROVIDE A REASONABLE OPPORTUNITY FOR ANY OWNER OF PROPERTY WITHIN THE PROPOSED ZONE TO PROTEST THE INCLUSION OF THEIR PROPERTY WITHIN THE PROPOSED ZONE, WHICH PROPOSED REINVESTMENT ZONE CONTAINS APPROXIMATELY 151 ACRES OF LAND GENERALLY LOCATED ALONG THE RIVER OAKS BOULEVARD CORRIDOR AND BEING WHOLLY LOCATED WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF RIVER OAKS, TEXAS.

At 8:46 p.m., Mayor Earwood opened the Public Hearing.

Kyle Sikorski representing Petty and Associates was present. Kyle briefly talked about what a TIRZ is. Tonight being brought before the Council is an Ordinance that creates the TIRZ and creates the board. Boundaries and board members can be changed in the future with an Ordinance amendment.

At 8:55 p.m., Mayor Earwood closed the Public Hearing.

11. ACTION FROM PUBLIC HEARING: CONSIDER ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE #1208-2018 CREATING THE TAX INCREMENT REINVESTMENT ZONE AND OTHER RELATED MATTERS.

CM Chisholm moved, seconded by CM Butler to approve Ordinance #1208-2018. All voted "Aye".

OTHER ITEMS THAT MAY REQUIRE COUNCIL ACTION:

12. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT WITH MULTATECH ARCHITECTS & ENGINEERS FOR ENGINEERING REQUIRED IN CREATING A REINVESTMENT ZONE.

Multatech will prepare a legal boundary description to support the city's TIRZ program.

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Chisholm to approve the agreement with Multatech Architects & Engineers not to exceed \$2,600.00. All voted "Aye".

13. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF REVISED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF FORT WORTH AND THE CITY OF RIVER OAKS TO FACILITATE CONSTRUCTION OF THE LAKE WORTH TRAIL THROUGH THE CITY OF RIVER OAKS AND REPEALING THE FORMER INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT AS APPROVED ON SEPTEMBER 25, 2018.

The Project Manager had left the City of Fort Worth and now there is another Project Manager which has changed the agreement. Residents that are affected need to be made aware of this project.

CM Chisholm moved, seconded by CM Ashton to approve the revised Interlocal Agreement with the City of Fort Worth and the City of River Oaks. All voted "Aye".

14. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF REQUEST FROM COMMUNITY CENTER CO-DIRECTOR, SHIRLEY WHEAT, TO WAIVE THE RENTAL FEE FOR LARRY MILLS.

Larry Mills was the Manager at SuperSave in River Oaks. He has given so much to the River Oaks community with numerous donations. Mr. Mills did not request the fee to be waived and this is a one-time request.

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Chisholm to approve a one-time waiving of the rental fee for Larry Mills. All voted "Aye".

15. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF ENGINEERING AND PROFESSIONAL SURVEY SERVICES FOR STREET, CURBING & GUTTER RECONSTRUCTION IN THE 4400 TO 4600 BLOCKS OF BYRD DRIVE (WOODLAWN TO SHENNA BLVD) TO BE EXPENDED FROM STORM WATER FUNDS.

Byrd Street from Shenna to Woodlawn is experiencing failures in both the street and the curb drainage system. City staff has asked City Storm Drainage Engineer Michael Thomas to review the situation and possible how to also incorporate the final road repairs with using the City's annual agreement with Tarrant County. After review, MJ Thomas Engineering presented a proposal to have the area surveyed and incorporate the survey into a concrete curb replacement project. Once the new curbs and possible driveway approaches are in place, the County then could come in and reconstruct the road to the new curb elevations. The road should start around April or May.

CM Butler moved, seconded by CM Scott to approve the survey services at a cost of \$19,000.00. All voted "Aye".

CM Chisholm moved, seconded by CM Butler to approve Resolution #946-2018. All voted "Aye".

17. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE #1207-2018 AMENDING CHAPTER 4 "BUSINESS REGULATIONS" OF THE RIVER OAKS CODE OF ORDINANCES (2006) AS AMENDED INCORPORATING ARTICLE 4.09 "SECONDARY METAL RECYCLERS" THAT PROVIDES DEFINITIONS, LICENSING, RECORDKEEPING AND ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURES FOR SECONDARY METAL RECYCLERS.

This ordinance is the result of a culmination of meetings and collaboration with the City of Fort Worth as well as Tarrant County Law Enforcement Executives Association. The City needs to have a strong and fair Ordinance in place for future use.

CM Ashton moved, seconded by CM Chisholm to approve Ordinance #1207-2018. All voted "Aye".
