With a quorum present, Mayor Earwood called the Regular Meeting of the River Oaks City Council to order at 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 26, 2013 at the River Oaks City Hall, 4900 River Oaks Blvd., River Oaks, Texas 76114.

7. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF **RESOLUTION 761-2013** PERMITTING AN OUTSIDE SPECIAL EVENT AT 5512 RIVER OAKS BLVD. (GENESIS JUJITSU) AS REQUESTED FOR BY ALBERT HUGHES

8. CONSIDER APPROVAL TO INSTALL HARDIBOARD SIDING IN A RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICT AT 1813 ROBERTS CUT OFF RD. AS REQUESTED BY JESUS BANDA

Jesus Banda, owner of the property at 1813 Roberts Cut Off, requested to install horizontal hardiboard on his residence.

Council Members requested this topic be presented to the City Council on a future agenda for consideration to remove the restriction for City Council approval.

CM Butler moved, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Crews, to approve horizontal hardiboard at 1813 Roberts Cut Off as requested by Mr. Banda. All voted "Ave."

9. CONSIDER APPROVAL TO INSTALL HARDIBOARD SIDING IN A RESIDENTIAL ZONING DISTRICT AT 610 HARRISDALE AVE AS REQUESTED BY SANDRA CONTRERAS

No representative. No discussion occurred.

Mayor Pro Tem Crews moved, seconded by CM Gordon, to approve horizontal hardiboard at 610 Harrisdale. All voted "Aye."

10. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE AWARDING OF CONTRACT FOR WATER LINE IMPROVEMENTS FOR MEANDERING ROAD AND YALE STREET AS BID ON MARCH 8, 2013

CS Gregory presented the lowest bid for the water line improvement on Meandering and Yale at \$424,015. It was previously projected that this project would cost \$290,000.

Keith Hamiliton, E.S.&C.M. representative, explained that the engineering firm originally anticipated the workload for the season to still be in a decline and therefore the cost to be more reasonable.

CM Gordon moved, seconded by CM Butler, to award the contract for water line improvements for Meandering Road and Yale Street as bid on March 8, 2013 in the amount of \$424,015 to Canary Construction contingent to satisfactory reference checks for the contracter and attorney review of the contract. All voted "Ave."

11. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF CHANGE ORDER ON THE WATER LINE IMPROVEMENTS FOR MEANDERING ROAD AND YALE STREET

No discussion.

12. DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION ON STAFF RECOMMENDATION TO STORM WATER TASK FORCE FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES REGARDING DRAINAGE STUDY ON INSPIRATION LANE

CS Gregory stated that improvements to the drainage systems on Inspiration Lane were not included in the Storm Water Management Plan. CS Gregory reported that this area would be considered by the Storm Water Task Force in the future and a recommendation presented accordingly.

[CM Gordon returned to the dais.]

13. REQUEST OF BARB CRAFT, LEVEL 1 DIABETES INSTRUCTOR, TO PROVIDE FREE COOKING CLASSES TO APPROVED EMPLOYEES IN EXCHANGE FOR A RATE REDUCTION

Barb Craft presented the opportunity for a city employee to participate in a free cooking class in exchange for an equivalent rate reduction at the Community Center.

Council Members expressed concern over spending tax dollars for the benefit of an employee.

No action was taken.

14. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF AN OUTDOOR RENTAL AT THE COMMUNITY CENTER FOR A FUND RAISING EVENT AS REQUESTED BY PETER WINCHESTER

16. CONSIDER APPROVAL TO AMEND THE DECEMBER 11, 2012 SUBSTANDARD BUILDING ORDER ON THE PROPERTY AT 620 WORTHVIEW DR.

Boyd Beavers, representative for the property owner at 620 Worthview, requested an additional 90 days to complete the repairs on the substandard property.

Building Inspector Sanders reported significant progress on the property, supporting 90 days for repair.

CM Butler moved, seconded by CM Gordon, to amend the substandard building order at 620 Worthview allowing an additional 90 days. All voted "Aye."

17. CONSIDER ADDITIONAL COUNCIL ACTION REGARDING THE PURCHASE OF A USED 2002 FREIGHTLINER GARBAGE TRUCK WITH 25-YARD LEACH PACKER APPROVED AT THE FEBRUARY 26^{TH} COUNCIL MEETING

Kelley Hooper explained that the actual purchase price of the used garbage truck is \$27,000, not \$25,000 as previously approved. After further negotiations with Equipment Southwest they agreed to a \$2,000 additional trade-in on the city's old Ford garbage truck dropping the actual total price down to \$25,000 as was approved by Council. Furthermore, Kelley Hooper estimates that with the \$2,000 trade in value, all the repair work and parts the dealer expended on the truck, the city ended up getting about \$8,500 for the old Ford Garbage Truck when you consider the city was going to have to make those same repairs from the money received for the old Ford.

The only other repair item not addressed was the tires that he initially reported would have to be changed out to be road ready, but upon further inspection he found that he only needed to replace two of the rear tires and since he had those tires in stock he would be able to avoid the cost of purchasing them keeping the actual cost to purchase the truck at \$25,000.

Joy Nowlin, property owner, presented a plan of action and requested 90-days to bring the property into compliance. Ms. Nowlin stated that she had given her estranged spouse the opportunity to complete the repairs. Ms. Nowlin requested clarification on some of the required repairs.

Inspector Sanders cited structural, plumbing, and electrical violations that constitute being deemed a substandard structure. Sanders reported that the condition of the property has not improved, even though a building permit was obtained that allowed 30-days for repairs. Sanders reported that Staff secured the property due to suspected vagrancy and overnight occupancy.

Ms. Nowlin verified that 4801 Buckskin is a valid mailing address to contact her.

[At 8:04 p.m. Mayor Earwood closed the public hearing.]

CM Ashton made the following motion, "I move that the City Council find that the building(s) located at 604 Frontier St. based on evidence presented at the hearing is substandard and: (1) That the conditions set forth in the Building Official's Report exist to the extent that the life, health, property, or safety of the public (and occupants of the building(s), if applicable) are endangered; and 2) That the main structure is/ are feasible of repair and therefore ORDER the building(s) to be repaired BY THE OWNER OF RECORD within 89 days and the LIENHOLDER OR MORTGAGEE OF RECORD to within an additional 30 days if the OWNER does not comply; and 3) The BOARD ORDERS commencement of repairs within 30-days and has established specific time schedules with the Owner of Record; and 4) ORDER that the building be repaired in conformance with the requirements of Section 3.07.004 of the River Oaks Code of Ordinances (2006) as amended or demolished by

the OWNER OF RECORD and the debris removed within 89 days or by the LIENHOLDER OR MORTGAGEE OF RECORD to within an additional 30-days if the OWNER does not comply and further find that if the building is not repaired within that time, that there is no reasonable probability that the building will be repaired within a reasonable period of time if additional time is given. If the building is not repaired within 89 days in full conformance of Section 3.07.004 of the River Oaks Code of Ordinances (2006), the building shall be demolished; and 5) Order that the substandard fee of \$150.00 be paid upon permit issuance. Certificate of Occupancy will not be finaled until all substandard fees are paid in full. Motion seconded by CM Gordon. All voted "Aye."

CM Gordon made the following motion, "I move that the City Council find that the building(s) located at 1619 Yale St. based on evidence presented at the hearing is substandard and: 1) That the conditions set forth in the Building Official's Report exist to the extent that the life, health, property, or safety of the public (and occupants of the building(s), if applicable) are endangered; and 2) That the building is/ are feasible of repair and therefore ORDER the Buildings to be repaired by the OWNER, within 89 days and the LIENHOLDER OR MORTGAGEE OF RECORD, if any to within an additional 30 days if the OWNER does not comply; and 3) The BOARD ORDERS commencement of repairs within 30-days and has established specific time schedules with the Owner of Record; and 4) ORDER that the building be repaired in conformance with the requirements of Section 3.07.004 of the River Oaks Code of Ordinances (2006) as amended or demolished by the OWNER and the debris removed within 89 days or by the LIENHOLDER OR MORTGAGEE OF RECORD to within an additional 30-days if the OWNER does not comply and further find that if the building is not repaired within that time, that there is no reasonable probability that the building will be repaired within a reasonable period of time if additional time is given. Mayor Pro Tem Crews moved, seconded by CM Butler, to approve Resolution #759-2013. All voted "Aye."

26. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF <u>ORDINANCE # 973-2013</u> AMENDING SECTION 13.02.113 "POLICIES" OF THE RIVER OAKS CODE OF ORDINANCES SPECIFICALLY IN 13.02.113(3) BRUSH, TREE LIMBS AND LOGS SUBSECTION (D) REGARDING COLLECTION OF OVERSIZED PILES

CS Gregory summarized Staff recommendations to the "Brush, tree limbs, and logs" portion of the Sanitation ordinance as follows:

"Section 13.02.113(3) "Brush, tree limbs and Logs"

- (C) All brush and tree limbs shall be limited to one (1) pile per lot on each residential customer account when stacked in a pile not exceeding twelve (12) feet in length, four (4) feet in width, and four (4) feet in height which are stacked neatly with the larger diameter of the limbs facing in one direction for easy handling and will be collected on bulk collection days tentatively scheduled for every Wednesday, except for holidays and/or in the event of unwarranted conditions restricting the ability of the city to remove the bulk items as regularly scheduled. All brush and tree limbs not meeting these guidelines will not be collected as a part of the normal city collection service. When any pile exceeds twelve (12) feet in length, four (4) feet in width, and four (4) feet in height it may be collected by the city at an additional charge upon the customer's request.
- (D) All oversized piles will be tagged by a sanitation superintendent and the resident will be notified of the reason that the pile was not collected. Piles that, in the superintendent's opinion, cannot be collected on the scheduled bulk collection day must be removed for an additional charge if removed by the city or else the customer may haul it off to an approved landfill at the customer's expense.
- (F) Logs over 12 inches in diameter will be limited to four (4) per brush collection provided the weight of each individual log does not exceed fifty (50) pounds. Logs over the limit will be tagged and if in the superintendent's opinion the logs that are over the limit cannot be removed on the scheduled bulk collection day then it is the responsibility of the customer to remove the logs at their own expense. The customer may request the city to remove the log or logs for an additional charge or choose to remove it/them on their [his/her] own.

CM Gordon moved, seconded by CM Butler, to approve Ordinance #973-2013. All voted "Aye."

- CS Gregory stated that Staff would amend the fee ordinance to reflect these changes and present to Council for approval.
