7. DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION ON LED STREET LIGHT PRESENTATION BY SHAWN REDDIE, AREA MANAGER OF ONCOR.

Shawn Reddie, Oncor was present and presented a slide show. In November 2017, a new Oncor tariff passed to install LED street lights. The mercury vapor and metal halides are closed. If a fixture fails, Oncor will replace at no cost with LED's; but if the bulb burns out, then no. The cost for the city is to replace the working fixtures with LED. If the City Council lists some streets that they are interested in replacing with LED's, an evaluation will be done and present a cost to the City Council. The city can opt in at any time.

## No action was taken.

8. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF RECOMMENDATION FROM E.S. & C.M. ENGINEERING AWARDING THE CONTRACT TO IPR SOUTH CENTRAL OF PASADENA, TEXAS FOR SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENTS FOR TEXAS WATER DEVELOPMENT BOARD CWSRF PROJECT NUMBER 73749.

Trevor Truss was present. February 21<sup>st</sup> was the bid opening and the low bid from IPR South Central of Pasadena, Texas of \$3,088,779.75 is recommended for approval. Once council approves, this will be sent to TWDB for their approval. PWD Smith and CS Gregory researched IPR South Central and they lead the nation in this type of industry. Roberts Cut off will be done first, then Truman, then the rest. There are 24 streets city-wide in this phase.

Mayor Pro Tem Ashton moved, seconded by CM Chisholm to award the contract with IPR South Central in the amount of \$3,088,779.75. All voted "Aye".

9. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE #1178-2018 APPROVING TARIFF AUTHORIZING AN ANNUAL RATE REVIEW MECHANISM ("RRM") AS A SUBSTITUTION FOR THE ANNUAL INTERIM RATE ADJUSTMENT PROCESS DEFINED BY SECTION 104.301 OF THE TEXAS UTILITIES CODE.

This has been going on since 2007. All that has changed is they went to a RRM tariff.

CM Scott moved, seconded by CM Butler to approve Ordinance #1178-2018. All voted "Aye".

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10. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF THE 2016-2017 FISCAL YEAR AUDIT REPORT AS PRESENTED BY WILLIAM SPORE, CPA AND APPROVAL OF ENGAGEMENT LETTER FROM WILLIAM C. SPORE, P.C. FOR THE ANNUAL AUDIT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2018.

William Spore, CPA presented the 2016-2017 Fiscal Year Audits.

Mayor Pro Tem Ashton moved, seconded by CM Butler to approve the 2016-2017 FY Audits and the engagement letter for the 2017-2018 FY Audit. All voted "Aye".

11. CONSDIER APPROVAL OF COMMUNICATIONS & SUBSCRIBER SERVICES AGREEMENTS WITH THE FORT WORTH REGIONAL RADIO SYSTEM IN ORDER FOR RIVER OAKS PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENT (POLICE & FIRE) TO JOIN THE FORT WORTH SYSTEM FOR THE MAINTENANCE & SUPPORT RELATED TO PUBLIC SAFETY RADIO SYSTEM INFRASTRUCTURE.

This system monitors when the radios are out of tune, etc. The cost is \$34 per radio per year. Once a month automatic radio checks will be done.

CM Scott moved, seconded by CM Chisholm to approve the agreement with the Fort Worth Regional Radio System. All voted "Aye".

12. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF CONTRACT AGREEMENT WITH LYSA FOR USE OF MCGEE PARK BALLFIELDS FOR BASEBALL & SOFTBALL SEASON.

The revised 5 year agreement was given out tonight.

Mayor Pro Tem Ashton moved, seconded by CM Butler to approve the revised agreement with LYSA as presented. All voted "Aye".

PC Spieldenner presented the 2017 Racial Profiling Report. Dividing out the number of citations for the year per day and per shift comes out to about 2 tickets per shift was written for the year.
