- 1. Call to Order at 6:33 pm by Vice- Chair: David Ballard
- 2. Member Roll Call: (Ballard, Ashton, Vandiver, Brooks)
- Approve Minutes from Meeting on June 5, 2014:
 David Ballard made the motion to approve the minutes. J.Lynn seconded the motion. All Aye.
- 4. Report from Council Liaison Joe Ashton: No report today
- 5. Discussion and/or Action on the recommendation to the council regarding planned improvements at Coates Park.
 - a. Mayor Earwood requested that we provide the original plans, the Before and the After.
- b. Noted: There are pictures of Coates Park (Before and After Project) located in the hallway at the River Oaks Community Center.

c. James Hatley has been looking for the original plan. He will check with Lori Watson, as she may have a copy of the original plans.

6. Workshop:

- I. Plans for planting flowers and bushes this Spring at Lion's Triangle.
 - a. David Ballard measured the Lion's Triangle upper level area = 448 square feet.
- b. Six cubic yards of the crushed decompressed granite, the cost would be approximately \$420.00.
- c. David asked James Hatley how much granite would be needed? James said that 4 inches deep would be enough to fill the garden area. (David asked how much heat the granite would give off and if the granite should cover the base of the plants? Mulch should be around the plants/flowers).
- d. David Ballard and James Myrick provided pictures of drought tolerate plants and flowers. Some examples are: Red Yucca, Sage and salvia.
- e. The Parks Department would use Parks Board funds to purchase plants, flowers, etc...what is needed.
- f. We will schedule a workshop for Thursday, 6/12 at 7 pm to meet at Kid's R Luv and go over to Lion's Triangle to decide as a team what is needed.
- g. We can present the plan to beautify Lion's Triangle to the City Council at their next Council meeting on 6/24.
- h. James Myrick reports that the Lion's Club and the River Oaks Historical Society members are interested in donating some of their funds to the Park Board. They would like to provide funds to install a base for the McGee Park Monument (located near the playground). The existing monument is very low to the ground. The monument would be better displayed with a base under it. Also, a bench to set in front of the monument is needed.

We should invite the Lion's Club Chairman- Randy Hooper to a Parks Board meeting.

We would need to decide if the Public Works employees would install or if we would have the Monument company install the base? This project would be reported in the River Oaks newspaper.
